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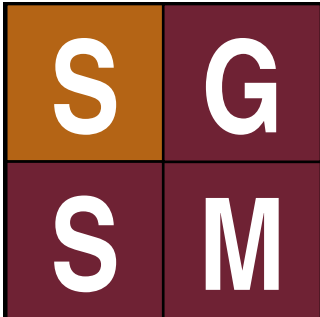


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Civil contractors believe construction market will rebound in 2021

More than half of civil contractors have high or very high confidence in the market's ability to provide them with new business in the next 12 months.

Civil contractors are increasingly optimistic about the outlook for new business over the next 12 months, according to Dodge Data & Analytics' latest findings in The Civil Quarterly (TCQ). While contractors surveyed reported having a challenging year in 2020, they believe that the market will rebound in 2021. However, most also reported that backlog levels have dropped against their ideal level for the third quarter in a row, dipping from a ratio of 92 in Q2 to 79 in Q4. This is attributed largely to the impact of the pandemic on construction businesses.

TCQ is the result of a partnership with Infotech, Hexagon and Command Alkon and Digital Construction Works, and is based on original research collected from civil contractors and engineers. It provides a quarterly snapshot of the current business health of contractors and explores trends in the industry.

Among the civil contractors surveyed in Q4, TCQ found:


More than half (58%) say they have high or very high confidence in the market's ability to provide them with new business in the next 12 months, up six points from the previous quarter.

One-third (32%) are expecting to see their profit margins increase in that time frame, compared with 25% in Q3.

The majority (65%) of those expecting an increase in profit margins or revenue also expect to see more opportunities for work.

Nearly half (45%) believe this increased pipeline will allow them to be more selective about targeting more profitable work.

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Civil contractors believe construction market will rebound in 2021

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However, the future outlook isn't entirely bright. The challenge of finding skilled workers has remained consistent with levels reported in Q2 2020. Given civil contractors' optimism about the volume of work available over the next year, it is not surprising that the majority of those surveyed (66%) expect the cost of skilled workers to increase in the next six months, a 13-point increase over Q2 data.

Trend in Digital Twins and Remote Inspection

In addition to regular business conditions, the Q4 TCQ focused on two emerging trends that could have a long-term influence on the industry: digital twins and remote inspection. While still not widely adopted across the industry, both are receiving increased attention.

Digital Twins

Just 10% of those surveyed were familiar with the concept of digital twins, and even fewer (9%) have had project owners express interest in the technology. Despite these low percentages, the majority (71%) of contractors believe that at least some owners will seek to create

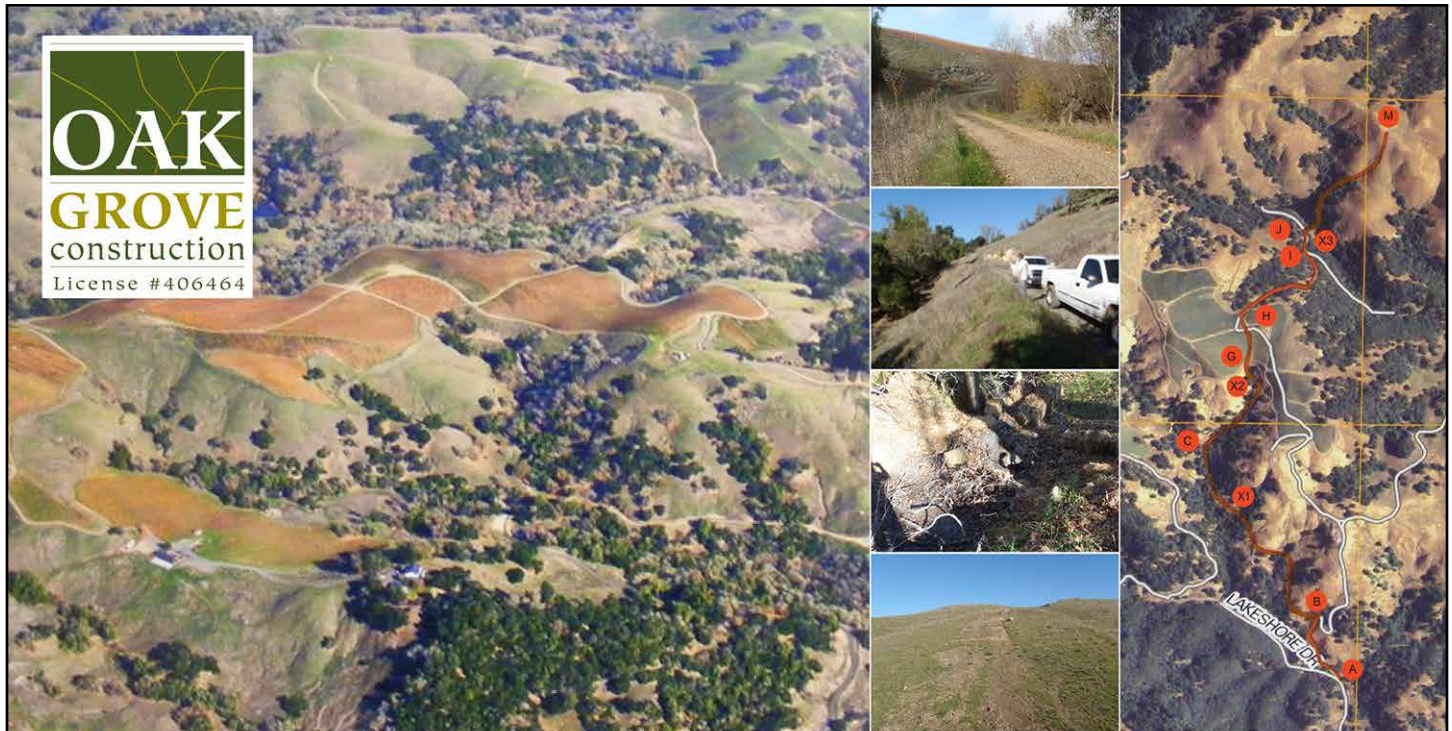
digital twins in the future, indicating a need for handover materials to support that goal.

Typically, a digital twin uses a building information model (BIM) as its base, but Q4 data found that only 39% of the contractors are currently using BIM. This suggests that the industry is not yet prepared to support owner interest in digital twins, despite their belief that it is likely to occur. It also suggests that contractors well-versed in BIM may have a competitive advantage in the future.

Remote Inspection

Remote inspections are also not yet widely used. Only 14% of industry respondents report experience with them and, of that number, only half cite experience prior to the start of the pandemic – indicating that the need to reduce in-person interactions did not have a major impact on inspections.

The Q4 report findings confirm that the industry is in the early adopter phase of using these tools. However, they also confirm that more than half of contractors – including the majority of those with experience with remote inspections and over half of those without – expect that the share of inspections done remotely will increase over the next three years.



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How to classify workers as employees or independent contractors

U.S. Department of Labor releases a final rule on independent contractor status under the Fair Labor Standards Act to go into effect March 8, 2021.

Unsure how you should classify workers? The U.S. Department of Labor has published a [final rule](#) that clarifies the differences between employees and independent contractors under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) that is set to go into effect March 8, 2021.

“NAHB views the new rule as a positive for the industry,” says David Jaffe, NAHB’s vice president of construction liability. If the final rule is implemented, he says there will be an improved business climate due to the clarifications and “adoption of a narrower ‘economic reality’ test to determine a worker’s status as an FLSA employee or an independent contractor.”

The final independent contractor rule clarifies the criteria used to classify a worker as an employee or an

independent contractor. In order to determine a worker’s status, companies can use an “*economic reality*” test that determines if they are economically dependent on the company, and thus an employee, or in control of their work, and thus an independent contractor. Employees are protected by the FLSA, while independent contractors are not. To fit a worker in one category or the other, an employer considers the nature of the work, the length of time of the work, what the worker stands to gain from it, and the level of control a worker has over the project.

The new final rule for independent contractors

The final rule identifies and explains two “*core factors*” for determining a worker’s status:

The nature and degree of control over the work. Little control could point to an employee, while more control points to a contractor.

The worker's opportunity for profit or loss based on initiative and/or investment. Less opportunity points to an employee, while more opportunity could point to an independent contractor.

It also touches on three other factors that can guide the decision, though the other two factors are the main decision points. Determining where a worker falls in these criteria should be based on actual rather than what could be contractually or theoretically possible, according to the final rule.

1. The amount of skill required for the work. No specialized skill could weigh in favor of an employee, while a more niche skill could point to a contractor.

2. The degree of permanence of the working relationship between the worker and the potential employer. Less permanence could indicate the position is more independent contractor in nature.

3. Whether the work is part of an integrated unit of production (*more integrated in regular business, more likely an employee*)

"This rule brings long-needed clarity for American workers and employers," says U.S. Secretary of Labor Eugene Scalia. "Sharpening the test to determine who is an independent contractor under the Fair Labor Standards Act makes it easier to identify employees covered by the Act, while recognizing and respecting the entrepreneurial spirit of workers who choose to pursue the freedom associated with being an independent contractor."

A much-needed clarification for contractors and gig workers

According to Jaffe, this final rule is a clarification of the prior administration's guidance about the differences between employee and contractual work. Although the

guidance outlined six factors for determining a worker's status, there was a lot of room for interpretation, and Jaffe says that it held a bias toward counting workers as employees.

"A lack of clarity and inconsistent measurement of the concept of economic dependence as a determining factor of employment has, for many years, presented a unique challenge to the residential construction industry due to its highly decentralized business structure," Jaffe says. "Home builders, as well as remodelers, typically subcontract a large portion of their construction work out to trade contractors who can more efficiently deliver individual pieces of the construction process. Specialized subcontractors perform much or even all the actual labor associated with most new home construction and renovation work."

Jaffe says that home builders' and remodelers' ability to compete efficiently depends on the predictability of overall costs, which is why NAHB is supportive of the clarity brought by the new final rule. *"This impact is of particular concern in the affordable housing sector where relatively small price increases can have an immediate impact on low*

to moderate-income homebuyers who are more susceptible to being priced out of the market," Jaffe says. "Given the highly decentralized business structure of the industry, a bias towards worker status as employees would have severe negative effects on the residential construction industry."

Getting sub agreements in writing is important. Here's why.

Application of independent contractor rule for construction

This new rule on independent contractors is highly consequential in the construction industry as it gives businesses more control over a worker's classification, according to NAHB. The U.S. Census Bureau's Current Population Survey (CPS) of Contingent Worker Supplement results found that primary independent contractors are most prevalent in the construction and professional and business services industries, which together employ 44 percent of primary independent contractors. Because independent contractors are not covered by the FLSA, businesses do not need to pay independent contractors minimum wage or overtime, so classifying workers who meet contractor criteria can be a cost savings for the company.

"In general, labor costs are lower for businesses that specialize in a particular activity compared to a business that attempts to do all tasks in-house," Jaffe says. "For most builders and remodelers, there is simply insufficient

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internal demand to justify hiring an employee for the numerous specialized and limited tasks required to complete a home project.”

Due to construction’s large share of independent contractors, NAHB sought examples in the new rule that would help outline its impact on the industry. Ultimately, the new rule included guidance on construction, housekeeping, and other industries with a high percentage of contractors. “NAHB is pleased that at our request the new rule includes specific examples of how it would relate to the construction industry,” NAHB said in a statement.

One example included in the final rule concerns a full-time worker at a renovation construction company. Even though the worker also has a food truck side hustle that generates income, she is still considered an employee rather than a contractor because she works hours set by the company for a set wage, does not have a meaningful opportunity to profit or increase her earnings from applying more initiative, and


the company determines her assignments. If the food truck income was related to renovations, the case may be different (*i.e. doing painting work for other renovation companies of which she chooses hours and projects*).

Independent contractor final rule may still have roadblocks ahead

The rule will take effect 60 days after its publication in the Federal Register. Still, the effective date could be delayed by legal challenges and changes in policy from the new Biden administration. “NAHB views the new rule as a positive for the industry,” Jaffe says. “Whether the final rule is implemented or not remains to be seen. We’re hopeful that the incoming Biden administration recognizes the importance of providing this clarity to employers and workers and opts not to rescind it.”

Although this new ruling would make it easier for remodelers to decide who is a contractor and who is an employee, some of the trades still worry about the misclassification of workers. For example, one of the comments from The United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America asserted that construction companies


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could misclassify workers “in order to pay them less than employees and cited estimates of the magnitude of the difference, and claims that the Department’s rule ‘does nothing to stem the abuse.’”

The Department of Labor says that the clarification of identification criteria will reduce misclassification. “Streamlining and clarifying the test to identify

independent contractors will reduce worker misclassification, reduce litigation, increase efficiency, and increase job satisfaction and flexibility,” says Wage and Hour Division Administrator Cheryl Stanton. “The rule we announced continues our work to simplify the compliance landscape for businesses and to improve conditions for workers. The real-life examples included in the rule provide even greater clarity for the workforce.”

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Three promising prospects for construction and infrastructure in 2021

There are positive opportunities ahead for the construction industry, with three key initiatives promising various forms of infrastructure investment.

Perhaps one of the most difficult years some of us have experienced yet in our lifetimes is behind us and 2021 appears a bit more hopeful. The construction industry weathered the 2020 storm better than most, but a great deal of uncertainty remains. As the year came to a close, backlogs had shrunk and demand for future new construction was tenuous as project owners hesitated due to a still struggling economy and the threat of a double-dip recession as COVID-19 cases continued to climb.

Yet, there are some promising prospects ahead. Additional infrastructure investment continues to be an active part of conversations on Capitol Hill. Infrastructure development is known historically to give economic growth a shot in the arm, so to speak, and is being touted as the

most effective means to ensure job growth and financial recovery in the coming months. Even if Congress fails to reach a bipartisan agreement for added funding, it will be forced to take up FAST Act reauthorization prior to its expiration this fall. Though reauthorization might come too late for much of 2021, it will improve prospects for the months and years that follow.

Another promising development is President-elect Biden's climate plan, which pledges to commit \$2 trillion to "launch a national effort aimed at creating the jobs we need to build a modern, sustainable infrastructure now and deliver an equitable clean energy future." Such a plan would require "millions of construction, skilled

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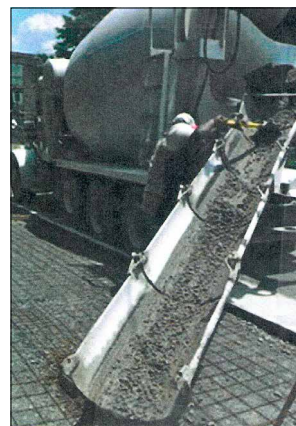

trades and engineering workers to build a new American infrastructure and clean energy economy."

Add to this House passage in early December of the Water Resources Development Act which — if passed by the Senate and signed into law — will allow for appropriation of \$10 billion in additional funds from the existing Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund Balance; authorize construction on 46 pending Army Corps Chief's Reports projects; authorize 27 feasibility studies; and improve the cost share between the general fund and the Inland Waterways Trust Fund for inland waterways projects, unlocking further construction funds. The legislation would provide added support to U.S. ports, harbors and inland waterways, as well as ecosystem restoration and flood mitigation in rural and urban communities.

Admittedly, there are no guarantees any of these three initiatives will move forward. But the need is substantial and there is clear public support for investing in U.S. infrastructure, as evidenced by the volume of transportation funding initiatives passed last November.

And while there are those who may not agree with all of the policies behind these initiatives, one thing we can agree on is that construction is likely to benefit if they move forward. Anything that can bring some certainty back into the industry's outlook is a win in my book.

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3 Myths about renting construction equipment and the truth about why to rent

It's time to shed some truth on the topic of rental and debunk three of the most common myths about renting equipment.

The earth is flat. Gin can cure gout. Microwaves cause cancer.

There are a lot of previously-held beliefs and notions that we know are no longer true. While these examples illustrate those that have been debunked for decades or centuries now, there's one in the construction industry that has only recently been changing.

It wasn't that long ago renting equipment wasn't viewed positively by most companies. But that's no longer the case. Especially within the past 10 to 15 years, rental has steadily grown in popularity and become an accepted piece of the fleet management puzzle. In fact, rental has become more than accepted; it's often viewed as the best option for companies to stay flexible, productive and profitable.

The Rise of Rental

There are now more avenues available for contractors to rent

equipment. No longer just big rental houses, renters have the option of working with smaller independent rental companies or their trusted equipment dealership. With more choices and many of these rental businesses growing their fleets, contractors have better opportunity to find what they're looking for and have a good experience.

And especially right now, the time has never been better to rent. Election years typically bring hesitation to buy, an infrastructure bill continues to be only talked about and COVID-19 – well, I think we all agree that COVID-19 has brought nothing but uncertainty.

Uncertain times have boosted rental in the past and likewise is the reason rental is hot now, with its popularity greater than expected this year. (*Find out more about why rental is surging*

this year in this episode of [RDO's video series, The Track](#)).

Even with practical reasons to rent, there are still hesitations for many companies. Why? Myths still exist about renting equipment.

It's time to shed some truth on the topic and debunk three of the most common myths about renting equipment.

Myth #1: Renting Equipment is Basically Throwing Away Money

Eventually buying the machine is a common goal when renting. However, many companies falsely believe that the money they spent renting is wasted, with none of that equity going into the machine.

Just about every rental house is willing to sell a rental machine to the customer, yet not all rental agreements

put the customer in the best position to come out positive. Long before it's time to buy, contractors should think about the likelihood of purchasing a machine and then build the rent-to-purchase option into the rental agreement. Going this route means price and purchase option terms can be set from the beginning, ensuring the customer doesn't lose out on valuable equity.

The real truth is: Rental equipment can provide a cost advantage if the agreement is well considered.

Myth #2: Rental Equipment is Crap

Yes, that myth puts it very bluntly – but it's exactly what rental skeptics believe. A commonly held rental myth is customers don't have the option to get quality, dependable machines.

However, there are plenty of later-model, low-hour, reliable machines available to rent.

Furthermore, rental machines don't have to be held back or reserved only for easy tasks. Many machines are capable of putting in the same long hours and hard work as their new counterparts.

Some companies even offer specialty equipment to rent beyond the standard backhoe and excavator, further expanding options and giving customers choices to find exactly what they need.

The real truth is: Rental equipment can be productive workhorses and just as dependable as new.

Myth #3 – Rental Equipment is Bare Bones with No Technology Features

Similar to the belief that only throw-away machines are offered to rent, many contractors believe they can't get the latest technology on rental equipment. But there are options to find a machine with the technology solution desired.

One avenue is renting machines with technology already integrated into the machine, like a John Deere Smartgrade dozer or motor grader, which comes with Topcon technology fully integrated into the machine.

The second option is renting the technology and adding it to an existing rental machine. Depending on factors such as the age and model of the machine, some equipment dealerships and other rental outlets are able to integrate new technology onto rental machines. Customers get exactly what they're looking for – not having to make a choice between the right machine or the desired technology.

The real truth is: Technology can likely be added to a rental machine or may even exist on the machine already.

Out with the Old – Mindset That Is

There are plenty of reasons for contractors to consider renting as an alternative to purchase or perhaps a way to make a future purchase work

better on the balance sheet. And of course, rental options are highly advantageous for those who have specialty projects, don't have available

cash or are uncertain about the nature of future work.

While we don't know what the future holds and what factors will still be affecting the construction industry into next year, one thing is for sure - renting equipment remains one of the best ways to stay flexible, productive and profitable amidst uncertainty.

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Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors

Our first question is a 'gas'! Yes, a contractor's misstep won't disappear until it's 'satisfied' and the 'company' you keep can, in some ways, add to your contractor license's scope ...

Q: Our company currently holds a "C-20" (HVAC) license and we are coming upon jobs that are requiring a "C-38" (Refrigeration) license because we are using refrigerants. Do you know if that is a requirement?

A: It is completely acceptable for a "C-20" Contractor to handle refrigerants. The CSLB doesn't really regulate the use of refrigerants, the Industry handles the regulations through requiring HVACR technicians to receive the proper training and carry the CFC card. However, from a CSLB perspective, it is permissible for a "C-20" Contractor to handle refrigerants.

Q: I currently have Sole Proprietorship license and I have a buddy who I would like to help get licensed. He doesn't have the necessary experience, so we are discussing forming a Corporation where I would act as the Responsible Managing Officer (RMO) and own at least 20% of the company. I understand that after five years he would meet the experience requirement and qualify to waive the exams. However, in the event there was a complaint or judgement

against the corporation, I certainly wouldn't want it to affect my personal license, nor would I want to be held responsible. Can you tell me how it works in these circumstances?

A: Any time there is an unsatisfied judgement, claim, or complaint against a license you are associated with, it will follow you and any other individuals associated with the license, to all other licenses each person is listed on.

Q: Our company currently has both a "C-61"/"D-12" (Synthetic Products) and a "C-8" (Concrete) license. We want to branch out the Concrete portion of our business, however we don't want to form an entirely separate company. Our intention is to obtain another license with a different business name which would specifically emphasize "Concrete". Do you have any recommendations?

A: Typically, what companies do in the situation you described is obtain a new license under the existing entity, but with a "dba" (doing business as) name attached to it with your "Concrete" specific business name. That way you aren't forming a whole separate entity, but it allows you to separate the concrete portion of the business with a different name. Being that it is the same entity, you can use the same Qualifying Individual you have on your current existing license.

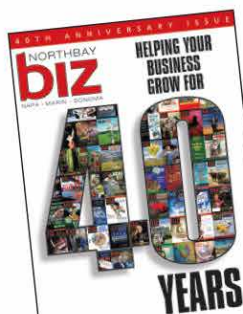
