OSHA inspected more construction sites last year than any other workplace

OSHA inspected construction workplaces last fiscal year more than it inspected any other industry, an agency administrator told attendees during a presentation at Associated General Contractors of America's Safety and Health conference Wednesday. Stephen Boyd, deputy regional administrator of OSHA's Region 6, offered a look at newly released construction fatality data and offered his thoughts on how to make jobsites safer. Boyd — who is based in Dallas and oversees several regional offices in Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Texas — shared Bureau of Labor Statistics fatality data from 2021 and inspection information from OSHA's fiscal year 2022, which ended Sept. 30 (BLS data usually lags by a calendar year). Falls remained the No. 1 cause of death on construction jobsites in 2021, with 378 workers dying as a result of a fall. That accounted for 38% of all jobsite worker deaths. Boyd said a large share of the falls happened on flat roofs or on skylights, likely because workers don't have the same instinctual sense of caution that comes from working on a pitched roof.

Many of construction's safety violations were on residential jobsites, and Boyd said 90% of those residential death and injury cases don't reach abatement, which in OSHA parlance means the resolution of a problem, payment of a fine or both. Instead, many residential offenders will fold, change names or disappear in another fashion, making it impossible to track down those responsible and hold them accountable for failing to provide a safe workplace. "There's really not a lot we can do as an agency," Boyd told conference goers, commenting on the sheer number of residential projects and limited resources. "It's a trend and it's probably going to stay a trend." On the other hand, general contractors on commercial projects rely on their longtime track records and reputation in the industry more than small home builders, so they are affected more when they are not in good standing with OSHA. Therefore, they much more frequently abate their fines and citations, he said.

Inspections and programs: In fiscal year 2022, just over half of all OSHA inspections were of construction jobsites, Boyd said. There's debate, he said, about whether or not compliance assistance or enforcement are key to protecting workers. Boyd said employers think compliance assistance is key, and internally, many at OSHA favor stronger enforcement. In reality, Boyd said he finds them equally important. This year OSHA will continue to work on developing new standards. For example, Boyd said plans for developing the heat illness standard will continue, though it takes a long time to bring it to fruition.

Employer-OSHA relationship: Boyd emphasized that employers have rights over their jobsite — such as to be present and able to see all hazards that an inspector may find during an inspection —- and that OSHA is responsible for following specific procedures when it comes to inspections. He shared multiple stories about employers going above and beyond typical protocols to keep jobsites safe. In one example, Boyd said he had agreed to reduce the potential number of fines for a contractor using a broken and dangerous ladder if they simply got rid of it. Though employees seemed to merely put the ladder away, the superintendent produced the ladder and crushed it with the Bobcat to show Boyd and the workers that it was unacceptable to use. Boyd indicated he thinks that OSHA highlights a lot of citations and other bad news to flex its enforcement muscles, but there is room for positivity."We don't publicize the good things that we see," Boyd said, saying that should change.

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Attorney General Bonta Warns Against Hiring Unlicensed Contractors, Price Gouging in Aftermath of Winter Storms

OAKLAND, CA – California Attorney General Rob Bonta today issued a consumer alert warning Californians to beware of fake and unlicensed contractors soliciting their services to Californians affected by damage from the recent winter storms.

In today's alert, Attorney General Bonta urges Californians to take precautions by hiring only licensed contractors and reminds businesses that price gouging during a state of emergency is illegal under Penal Code Section 396. As noted by the Contractors State License Board (CSLB), anyone who contracts for work in a state or federal natural disaster area without an active state contractor license may be subject to felony charges.

"As Californians recover from the devastating storms, the last thing they should worry about is being scammed by bad actors," said Attorney General Bonta. "We will not tolerate those who take advantage of consumers during this time of struggle for many. I urge all Californians to be diligent and do their research before making any kind of home repair through a contractor. Additionally, if you believe you have been a victim of price gouging, report it to your local authorities or to my office at oag.ca.gov/report."

"Disaster survivors take a huge risk when they hire unlicensed contractors," said CSLB Registrar David Fogt. "Most are not properly insured and likely don't have the skills or knowledge to perform the work. It is important to verify on CSLB's website the person you are working with is included on CSLB's license records."

Don't Fall Victim to Unlicensed Contractors

The California Department of Justice works closely with the Contractors State License Board (CSLB) to ensure residents do not fall victim to unlicensed home reparation and reconstruction services. As a reminder, CSLB encourages everyone to check all contractors' license numbers on the CSLB website and check each contractor's pocket license to confirm the listed personnel on the license. Complaints against contractors for unlicensed practices and other violations of contractor's license law can be filed online.

Additional tips and recommendations from CSLB:

- Don't rush into repairs or cleanup, no matter how badly they're needed.
- Don't sign over any payment checks from your insurance company.
- Hire only California-licensed contractors. Ask to see the license. The license number must be on all ads, contracts, and business cards.
- Don't pay more than 10 percent down or \$1,000 whichever is less.
- Don't pay cash, and don't let the payments get ahead of the work. Only pay for work as it is completed to your satisfaction.
- Avoid making the final payment until you're satisfied with the job.

Price Gouging Laws Remain in Effect

California law generally prohibits charging a price that exceeds, by more than 10%, the price of an item before a state or local declaration of emergency. For any item a seller only began selling after an emergency declaration, the law generally prohibits charging a price that exceeds the seller's cost of the item by more than 50%. This law applies to those who sell food, emergency supplies, medical supplies, building materials, and gasoline. The law also applies to repair or reconstruction services, emergency cleanup services, certain transportation services, freight and storage services, hotel accommodations, and rental housing. Exceptions to this prohibition exist if, for example, the price of labor, goods, or materials has increased for the business.

Attorney General Bonta Warns Against Hiring Unlicensed Contractors, Price Gouging in Aftermath of Winter Storms

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Violators of the price gouging statute are subject to criminal prosecution that can result in a one-year imprisonment in county jail and/or a fine of up to \$10,000. Violators are also subject to civil enforcement actions including civil penalties of up to \$2,500 per violation, injunctive relief, and mandatory restitution. The Attorney General and local district attorneys can enforce the statute.

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Top 10 California Laws, Regs for 2023

A slew new laws and regulations that affect California businesses are taking effect for 2023.

Last year was a busy one, with ground-breaking new laws on employee pay disclosures, a law prohibiting discrimination against cannabis-using employees and another expanding the circumstances when employees can take leave to care for a loved one.

The following are the top 10 laws and regulations that employers in the Golden State need to stay on top of.

1. Pay disclosure

This sweeping law in part requires more disclosure of pay information by employers. Until this year, employers had only been required to provide the pay scale for a position upon reasonable request by a job applicant. SB 1162 goes a step further by:

• Requiring employers, upon request by a current employee, to provide the pay scale of the position they are employed in.

• Requiring employers with 15 or more workers to include pay scale in any job postings for open positions.

• Requiring employers to maintain records of job titles and wage rate history for each employee while employed for the company, as well as three years after their employment ceases.

Note: The law defines "pay scale" as the salary or hourly wage range that the employer "reasonably expects" to pay for the position.

Penalties range from \$100 to \$10,000 per violation. This law took effect Jan. 1, 2023.

2. State of emergency and staff

This new law, SB 1044, bars an employer, in the event of a state of emergency or emergency condition, from taking or threatening adverse action against workers who refuse to report to, or leave, a workplace because they feel unsafe.

"Emergency condition" is defined as:

• Conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons or property caused by natural forces or a criminal act.

• An order to evacuate a workplace, worksite or worker's home, or the school of a worker's child due to a natural disaster or a criminal act.

SB 1044 also bars employers from preventing

employees from using their mobile phones to seek emergency assistance, assess the safety of the situation or communicate with another person to confirm their safety.

The law, which took effect Jan. 1, 2023, does not cover first responders and health care workers.

3. Cannabis use and discrimination

This law bars employers from discriminating in hiring, termination or other conditions of employment based on employees using cannabis

while off duty.

The bill's author says the legislation is necessary because THC (tetrahydrocannabinol), the active ingredient in marijuana, can stay in a person's system after they are no longer impaired. As a result, drug testing may detect THC in an employee's system even if they used it weeks earlier and it is having no effect on their job performance.

AB 2188 does not require employers to permit employees to be high while working.

The bill would exempt construction trade employees and would not preempt state or federal laws that require employees to submit to drug testing. This law takes effect Jan. 1, 2024.

4. Leaves of absence

The California Family Rights Act and the state's paid sick leave law allow employees to take leave to care for a family member, defined as a spouse, registered domestic partner, child, parent, parent-in-law, grandparent, grandchild or sibling.

The definition has been expanded to include "any individual relatedby blood or whose association with the employee is equivalent of a family relationship" as of Jan. 1.

5. Contractor workers' comp

Starting July 1, the following contractors must carry workers' compensation coverage regardless of if they have employees or not:

- Concrete (C-8 license),
- Heating and air conditioning (C-20),
- Asbestos abatement (C-22), and
- Tree service (D-49).

Starting Jan. 1, 2026, all licensed contractors must have coverage.

6. OSHA citation postings

Under current law, employers that receive citations and orders from OSHA are required to post them in or near the place the violation occurred, in order to warn employees about a potential hazard. Starting Jan. 1, 2023, they must post the notice not only in English, but also: Spanish, Chinese (Cantonese, Mandarin), Vietnamese, Tagalog, Korean, Armenian and Punjabi.

7. Permanent COVID standard

Cal/OSHA has a permanent COVID-19 preven-

tion standard that will sunset in 2024. The new standard, which replaces the temporary emergency standard the agency had implemented, should provide more certainty for prevention procedures and practices. Here are the main takeaways:

• Employers are no longer required to pay employees while they are excluded from work due to COVID-19, or to screen employees daily.

• Employers must still notify and provide paid testing to employees who had a close contact in the workplace.

• Employers can now incorporate written COVID-19 procedures into their Injury and Illness Prevention Programs.

8. CalSavers expanded

SB 1126 requires any person or entity with at least one employee to either provide them with access to a retirement program like a 401(k) plan or enroll them in the state-run CalSavers program. Prior to this new law only companies with five or more employees that do not offer a retirement plan were required to enroll their workers in CalSavers.

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

9. Bereavement leave

Employers with five or more workers are required to provide up to five days of bereavement leave upon the death of a family member, that came into effect on Jan. 1.

This leave may be unpaid, but the law allows workers to use existing paid leave available to them, such as accrued vacation days, paid time off or sick leave. Employers are authorized to require documentation to support the request for leave.

10. PFL wage replacement

This law was passed last year, but does not take effect until 2025. Existing California law allows employees to apply for Paid Family Leave

and State Disability Insurance, both of which provide partial wage replacement benefits when employees take time off work for various reasons under the California Family Rights Act. Starting in 2025, low-wage earners (those who earn up to 70% of the state average quarterly wage) will be eligible for a higher percentage of their regular wages under the state's PFL and SDI benefit programs.



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Nail Gun Safety

Nail guns significantly reduce the time it takes to build houses, refinish floors, and do other jobs. However, as is often with efficient tools, they can cause serious injuries and death if safety procedures aren't followed.

HAZARDS OF NAIL GUNS

According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, nail gun injuries account for 37,000 trips to the hospital per year. Hazards involving nail guns include:


- Injuries to hands and fingers, and feet
- Bone fractures
- Noise damage to ears
- Injuries to spinal cord, head, and neck
- Injuries to eyes (including blindness) from nails or splinters caused by the nail gun
- Brain damage
- Muscle/bone disorders from carrying the heavy gun and trying to stabilize it when it kicks
- Death

Even if you think that the injury is small, still seek medical care. Doctors may catch something you weren't aware of, such as a shattered bone from the nail, or they may prevent complications such as an infection.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF TRIGGERS

Contact trip triggers: The nail gun fires as long as the nose of the gun and the trigger are both pressed down.

Sequential triggers: The nail gun only fires if the nose is pressed down before the trigger is pulled. The operator must release the trigger and repeat the sequence. Less accidents happen with the sequential trigger than the contact trip trigger.

DOS OF USING THE NAIL GUN

- Be properly trained
 - o Proper training includes learning the operation of the nail gun and getting supervised hands-on experience
 - o Get refresher training if you have been involved in an accident with nail guns
- Read the owner's manual

o Each nail gun can be a little different

- Inspect the nail gun, nails, and power sources to make sure they are working properly
- Wear Personal Protective Equipment, such as eye protection and ear protection
- Set up jobs to minimize the need for nailing at a high level
 - o If you must nail in an awkward position, consider using a hammer instead of a nail gun
- Keep your fingers away from the trigger when you aren't driving nails
- Keep your hands and feet away from the place you are driving nails
 - o Irregularities in the wood could cause the nail to move to a different place from where you wanted it to go
- Follow your workplace procedures for nail guns

DON'TS OF USING THE NAIL GUN

- Do not rest the gun against any part of your body
 - o This includes trying to climb a ladder with the gun cradled against your body
- Do not carry the gun by the electrical cord or air power source
- Do not modify or tamper with the operating controls
- Do not point the gun at anybody
- Do not carry the gun with your finger on the trigger
- Do not try to service the nail gun with the air supply still attached to the gun
- Do not use a nail gun with your non-dominant hand
- Do not use a nail gun if you are tired or unable to focus


Use good judgment and common sense when operating a nail gun. Remember especially not to operate a nail gun without training, and to never tamper with the operating controls. Nail guns may save time, but the time saved is not worth it if you are injured.













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
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
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

Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors

Looks like the state next to us has been looking at our answers! I validate an assumption, which as an expert I am not able to do very often, and 'revive' hope that a license can be regained...

Q: We have several businesses in CA with licenses. We seem to continually be dealing with Qualifiers disassociating which in turn leaves the company scrambling to replace them within the 90-day time limit. I would like to explore the option of spreading our more "permanent" Qualifiers across multiple locations. Am I correct that a Responsible Managing Officer (RMO) can have their license used at up to three locations? And a Responsible Managing Employee (RME) is limited to just two? Lastly, I'm assuming the RMO/RME is required to be employed by the company as opposed to an Independent Contractor?

A: An RMO can have their license used for up to three licenses within a one-year period as long as one of the following exists:

- They own at least 20% of each company,
- One company owns at least 20% of the other, OR
- The majority of the personnel are the same on each license (this is the condition you guys use).

RME's can only be on two if (b) or (c) listed above is true, you are correct. You are also correct regarding the employment of the RME/RMO; he/she should be employed by the Company as opposed to a 1099 contractor.


Q: I had a contractor's license years ago, but I let it go when I went to work for a Company who was already licensed. I want to reactivate my license. What does that require? I've tried calling the CSLB, but I've gotten a couple of different answers, so my buddy referred me to you.

A: Good call, pleases pass along my appreciation to your friend. I looked up your license and it has been expired for over five years so you will be required to take the exams again to get the license back. You will also need to be fingerprinted and obtain a bond. Since it's a Sole Owner license, you can request that the number be re-issued to you. We of course would be happy to assist you with the process.

The Nevada State Contractors Board (NSCB) has introduced a new "B-7" Residential Remodeling Classification. Upon approval, a contractor licensed in the new Residential Remodeling subclassification is authorized to engage in the remodeling and improvement of an existing single-family residence or unit. Last year, the Legislative Commission finalized the regulations establishing the new classification and the Board began accepting applications this week.

Before a regulation was passed recently establishing the new classification, a contractor had to obtain a full "classification "B" license or a "subclassification "B-2" license to perform residential remodeling work. Additionally, a classification existed for "commercial remodeling", "subclassification "B-6", but not for residential remodeling. The Board saw a demand both by the construction industry and members of the public to establish a classification that recognizes residential remodeling projects may not require all of the specific skills and expertise demanded of classification B and/or subclassification B-2 licensees.
