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A reminder about Cal/OSHA's posting requirement

Our friends at the California Employers Association have reminded us that every year from Feb. 1st through April 30th, most employers are required to post Cal/OSHA Form 300A in a conspicuous place where a company normally posts this kind of employee information.

That 3-month time period is underway and unless you are an employer with fewer than 10 employees or are an organization that is classified in a specific, low-hazard category – both of which are exempt – the posting requirement affects you.



US Department of Labor issues stronger workplace guidance on coronavirus

New OSHA guidance seeks to mitigate, prevent viral spread in the workplace

WASHINGTON, DC – The U.S. Department of Labor announced today that its Occupational Safety and Health Administration has issued stronger worker safety guidance to help employers and workers implement a coronavirus protection program and better identify risks which could lead to exposure and contraction. Last week, President Biden directed OSHA to release clear guidance for employers to help keep workers safe from COVID-19 exposure.

"Protecting Workers: Guidance on Mitigating and Preventing the Spread of COVID-19 in the Workplace" provides updated guidance and recommendations, and outlines existing safety and health standards. OSHA is providing the recommendations to assist employers in providing a safe and healthful workplace.

"More than 400,000 Americans have died from COVID-19 and millions of people are out of work as a result of this crisis. Employers and workers can help our nation fight and overcome this deadly pandemic by committing themselves to making their workplaces as safe as possible," said Senior Counselor to the Secretary of Labor M. Patricia Smith. "The recommendations in OSHA's updated guidance will help us defeat the virus, strengthen our economy and bring an end to the staggering human and economic toll that the coronavirus has taken on our nation."

Implementing a coronavirus protection program is the most effective way to reduce the spread of the virus. The guidance announced today recommends several essential elements in a prevention program:

Conduct a hazard assessment.

Identify control measures to limit the spread of the virus.

Adopt policies for employee absences that don't punish workers as a way to encourage potentially infected workers to remain home.

Ensure that coronavirus policies and procedures are communicated to both English and non-English speaking workers.

Implement protections from retaliation for workers who raise coronavirus-related concerns.

"OSHA is updating its guidance to reduce the risk of transmission of the coronavirus and improve worker protections so businesses can operate safely and employees can stay safe and working," said Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for Occupational Safety and Health Jim Frederick.

The guidance details key measures for limiting coronavirus's spread, including ensuring infected or potentially infected people are not in the workplace, implementing and following physical distancing protocols and using surgical masks or cloth face coverings. It also provides guidance on use of personal protective equipment, improving ventilation, good hygiene and routine cleaning.

OSHA will update today's guidance as developments in science, best practices and standards warrant.

This guidance is not a standard or regulation, and it creates no new legal obligations. It contains recommendations as well as descriptions of existing mandatory safety and health standards. The recommendations are advisory in nature, informational in content and are intended to assist employers in recognizing and abating hazards likely to cause death or serious physical harm as part of their obligation to provide a safe and healthful workplace.

Under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, employers are responsible for providing safe and healthful workplaces for their employees. OSHA's role is to help ensure these conditions for America's working men and women by setting and enforcing standards, and providing training, education and assistance.









2020-Won! New laws in 2021 related to the construction industry

Although 2020 was a year no one ever saw coming, the legislature was still busy enacting new laws. The Contractors State License Board released an industry bulletin highlighting some construction-related laws that go into effect on January 1, 2021. Below is an excerpt from that publication. Take a look at the change for an extension for seniors' right to cancel a contract (AB 2471) and the direct authority for the registrar to take disciplinary action for tree worker safety violations (AB 2210). These updates, and the others mentioned below, may impact the way contractors conduct business.

AB 2471 (Maienschein): Extends the right to cancel contracts for persons 65 years of age or older from three business days to five business days for the following transactions: home solicitation contracts, home improvement contracts, Property Assessed Clean Energy assessment contracts, service and repair contracts, and seminar sales contracts.

AB 1551 (Arambula): Relates to Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) financing home improvements through

PACE assessment contracts, as regulated by the California Financing Law and the Streets and Highways Code. AB 1551 prohibits "prepayment penalties" in PACE assessment contracts and prohibits PACE assessments on properties with reverse mortgages. This bill also requires the PACE Financing Estimate and Disclosure be provided to the homeowner in printed, paper form, unless the property owner signs a printed paper document opting out of a hard copy; if they opt-out, they may receive the disclosure electronically.

AB 2210 (Aguiar-Curry): Authorizes disciplinary action against a licensed contractor for violations of tree worker safety regulations administered by the California Division of Occupational Safety and Health without regard to whether death or serious injury to an employee resulted from the violation. This bill also extends the time for the CSLB registrar to bring disciplinary action against a licensed contractor for violations of the Labor Code or the specified tree safety regulations from 180 days to 18 months.

AB 3087 (Brough): Authorizes the CSLB registrar to contract with a public or private organization to administer, and provide services and materials for, CSLB's contractor license exams.

SB 865 (Hill): Makes several changes to the Dig Safe Act of 2016, including renaming the California Underground Facilities Safe Excavation Board to "*Dig Safe Board*"; updating requirements about the exchange of information

and records between the Dig Safe Board and regional notification centers (RNC); requiring that all new subsurface installations use specified mapping technology; and requiring that an excavator notify the RNC within 48 hours of discovering or causing damage. The bill also updates some of the enforcement responsibilities of the Dig Safe Board, including the option to require that violators take an educational course in lieu of paying a fine.

SB 1189 (McGuire): Creates a new classification of contracting business called "residential remodeling contracting," which is defined as projects that make improvements to, on, or in an existing residential wood frame structure that use at least three unrelated building trades or crafts for a single contract; a list of trades is included in the bill. The bill also includes in the definition of "home improvement" the reconstruction, restoration, or rebuilding

of residential property damaged or destroyed by a disaster for which either the governor or president has declared a state of emergency. The bill also expands the type of contracting activity in a declared disaster zone for which a person without a contractor license can be prosecuted.

SB 1474 (Committee on Business, Professions and Economic Development): Requires the CSLB registrar to retroactively reinstate an expired contractor license if a completed license renewal application is received with the appropriate fees within 90 days of the license expiration date. It also makes several minor, technical, nonsubstantive changes to the law.

For public works construction projects, the specifications are very explicit as to what the engineer wants the contractor to furnish and install. So, when you receive a materials or equipment price quote from a vendor to include in your bid, always remember to do the following:

Confirm they can meet a delivery schedule that complies with the contract completion date.

Confirm they are quoting on the make and model that meets specifications!

Be sure the sales tax and freight costs are included.

Use a Purchase Agreement with language that obligates the vendor to comply with all aspects of the contract specifications. Never use a standard or simplistic Purchase Order.

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Revising the standard for construction and demolition workers

A revised standard from ANSI/ASSP aims to improve worker safety on the job site.

Construction and demolition sites can be some of the most dangerous job sites. Multiple contractors and employers can add complexity and confusion to an already crowded environment.

A newly revised standard from the American Society of Safety Professionals (ASSP) and American National Standards Institute (ANSI) is designed to help employers keep construction workers safe through updated best practices.

ANSI/ASSP A10.33-2020, Safety and Health Program Requirements for Multi-Employer Projects, identifies ways organizations can create and manage a safety program in a shared construction project. The standard assists project owners, construction supervisors, contractors and equipment manufacturers.

"Risks on construction and demolition sites are dynamic and continuously evolve as conditions, technologies and participants change," said John Johnson, CSP, chair of the A10 committee, in a press release. "Enhanced safety performance is achieved when the entire project hierarchy—from the owner to the craft workers—engages in an identified safety process."

ASSP is the secretariat for many standards committees in the United States and worldwide. The global nonprofit develops safety and health management plans to prevent injuries, illnesses and deaths and helps ensures standards are developed and revised in accordance with ANSI and the International Organization for Standardization (ISO).







It's not time to relax yet

Even with new COVID-19 vaccines and new leadership in Washington, workers still aren't quite ready to go back to the workplace.

A new year starts a new chapter in the mission of keeping the workplace safe. We have a new president, and both houses of Congress are now under the same party; there is new leadership at the Department of Labor (including OSHA) and the Department of Transportation (including the Federal Motor Carriers Safety Administration); new heads of the Environmental Protection Agency and the Food and Drug Administration; and in fact an entirely new regulatory mission on the part of the government when it comes to EHS matters.

However, we still have some of last year's problems, chief among them catching COVID-19 and the fear of returning to the workplace. Convincing the entire U.S. population that it's safe to go back into the workplace is not going to be easy, no matter how much in sync the Executive and Legislative branches of the government are aligned, and no matter how quickly vaccines are produced and administered. And it's going to continue to be a daunting hurdle for every safety leader to confront the reality that some of their workers are not merely a little bit uneasy about going back into the workplace—they're just plain scared.

There have been all sorts of polls and surveys conducted lately, asking people about their readiness and willingness to return to the workplace. Here are some recent findings:

- 54% of respondents who've been working from home during the pandemic say they'd prefer to continue doing so after the pandemic ends. Meanwhile, of those people who have had to report to their traditional workplace, 54% say they're worried about being exposed to COVID-19 from their fellow workers (Pew Research Center).
- 38% say that would accept a 10% pay cut if it meant they could continue working at home (TalentLMS).
- 49% think that the pandemic in the United States is behind us, but 47% think that the worst is yet to come (CNN).
- 35% say they're not willing to be vaccinated against the virus (Gallup).

An optimistic reading of those survey results would suggest that most people are hopeful that someday soon they'll be looking at COVID-19 through their rearview mirror and their personal and work lives will have resumed some sense of pre-pandemic normalcy. A less-optimistic interpretation, however, is that a large number

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
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

of people feel the entire world is still on "pause," with no definable end in sight and rumors of a more contagious form of the virus prompting calls for people to start double-masking. No matter how you look at the survey results, one thing is beyond dispute: The role of EHS managers is only going to get even more intense, as workplace safety protocols continue to evolve, reflecting the new administration's guidelines, the impact (or lack thereof) of vaccinations, and the insidious reluctance of the coronavirus to just go away already.

For those of you longing for "the good ol' pre-COVID days" when we had other EHS-related things to talk about, I ventured into the EHS Today archives to see what I wrote in my column a year ago, the last one before the pandemic. Unfortunately, the topic I wrote about then was an equally disturbing subject: a 2% rise in workplace deaths from 2017 to 2018. I wish I could report that the latest annual tally from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics shows an improvement, but that's not the case. In 2019 (the BLS has always been a year behind in its reports, despite having access to the fastest computers and data analytics processors in the world), there was again a 2% increase in fatal work injuries compared to the previous year. In fact,


there were 5,333 workplace fatalities in 2019, the largest annual number since 2007.

"With many safety advancements being readily available to employers nationwide, it's troubling that we're continuing to see higher numbers of worker fatalities," said Deborah Roy, president of the American Society of Safety Professionals (ASSP). "Strong workplace cultures that bring together management and employees while including safety and health climates must become a priority for all companies and organizations."

Echoing the ASSP, the National Safety Council (NSC) expressed its concern over the increase in fatalities, and added an "even more alarming" observation that these are pre-pandemic figures. "2020 data could be far bleaker given COVID-19's impact on workplace safety," the NSC cautioned.

Let's hope the NSC is wrong, and that the heightened calls to the entire population to take safety very seriously will result in fewer workplace fatalities (although it's unclear exactly how the BLS will determine if a COVID-related death should be considered a workplace fatality). But one thing is clear: Workers are very skittish right now about coming into the workplace, so the vigilance of EHS leaders will be vital to ensuring that we all are able to resume our work lives in safe and healthy environments.











Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors

Our first contractor is 'testing' the waters for a waiver, while another is really a 'spin off' problem. I also assist in sorting out the general rules in 'engineering' our final answer for a Builder's Exchange member ...

Q: My Texas company wants to obtain a CA license for several projects we have been awarded, IF we have the license. My company wants me to be the Qualifier on their General Building license because I am the most qualified person in our company, but to be honest, I am 54 years old. I know how to pass an exam and I've done it for several States in the past, but I just don't want to sit for exams anymore. I also have a college degree. I've seen on your website there is way to qualify for a Waiver. Can you help with that?

A: Thank you for contacting Capitol Services Inc. Your college degree will gain you credit for the work experience

requirement (up to three years, depending on your degree and the classes you took), but you absolutely need to have at least one year of experience working hands-on in the field. Waivers are a request for consideration from the CSLB, but you need to have all your 'ducks in a row' before asking.

A: It is never acceptable to work under another entity's license. The Company signing the contract, as well as the entity performing the work, both need to be properly licensed. Give me a call if you would like to discuss how this may be able to work.

Q: I read your columns in the local Builder's Exchange magazines. I have a question for you. Doesn't the "C-10" cover overhead and underground power transmission and distribution line, substations, and solar/wind farm

construction? The company in question was attempting to apply for the "A" and I told them I didn't think they would qualify based on their scope of work.

A: This work kind of tiptoes around the "A" or General Engineering classification though and if there is any specialized engineering involved, the "A" classification would be the most appropriate. A high-rise building with a complex foundation would likely require the "A" license.

Some paperwork delays remain as Covid rules are still keeping some government agency staff at home, but progress is coming as CSLB Testing Centers are open again. If you need expert assistance quickly, give us a call or email your question and I can likely provide insight on it immediately.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Please find attached a list of the bills that have been introduced (as of today) that may impact the construction industry. A couple of bills on redefining defensible space were introduced. Please let us know if any bills catch your attention (negative or positive).

CALIFORNIA DEFORESTATION-FREE PROCUREMENT ACT INTRODUCED

Introduced last night, <u>AB 416</u>: the California Deforestation-Free Procurement would require a contractor doing any work state public work project to certify that the commodities were not grown, derived, harvested, reared, or produced on land where tropical deforestation or boreal intact forest degradation or deforestation occurred on or after January 1, 2022.

CSLB LICENSE TRIGGER BEING RAISED

CSLB-backed legislation, <u>\$B\$ 304</u>, was introduced to raise the non-licensed work threshold from \$500 to raise the maximum aggregate contract price eligible for exemption to \$1,000.

LAWMAKERS VOW TO REFORM EDD

A group of California Assemblymembers calling themselves an unemployment reform "working group" unveiled a slate of proposals Thursday to overhaul the beleaguered Employment Development Department. The move follows two scathing state audits that reveal how EDD may have paid up to \$31 billion in fraudulent claims, as well as a flurry of legislative hearings on months-long benefit payment delays. The bills in the reform package would:

Allow claimants to access unemployment benefits by direct deposit, rather than debit card or paper check.

Require unemployment claimants to be cross-checked with prison and jail rosters.

Allocate \$55 million for local and state fraud investigations.

Create a new board within the state Labor Department to oversee EDD.

TREATED WOOD WASTE UPDATE

On February 3rd the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) released additional information on its website (https://dtsc.ca.gov/treated-wood-waste-variances/) about applying for a variance for treated wood waste (TWW) management. Specifically, DTSC has released additional details on each of the six variance types that will be offered, and has also released the questions that will be asked in order to apply for a variance. DTSC is still planning to release the online variance application system on February 16, 2021. AB 332 is the bi-partisan legislative vehicle that we are pursuing to provide a statutory fix.

CA BOARD FORESTRY & FIRE UPDATE

A new strikeout/underline draft will be released on Monday, February 8th. While the February 9th workshop is canceled there will be a workshop the week of February 22nd to provide additional time to review and provide feedback on the February 8th draft. The coalition of industry stakeholders are submitting responses COB Wednesday, February 17th.

HOW THE PRO ACT WOULD CHANGE THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY

By redefining "employees" and "employers" in revisions to the National Labor Relations Act, the Protecting the Right to Organize Act grants benefits to workers previously classified as independent contractors. Reintroduced in Congress Thursday, the bill has major implications for construction firms and the workers they employ. **Read more here**.
