OSHA is urging employers to be vigilant in protecting temporary and young workers this summer

Acknowledging that may employers in a variety of industries – including construction – are turning to temporary and young workers more than in the past, OSHA has issued some reminders (and warnings) to employers who are trying to fill the employment gaps business is facing.

What a surprise! Construction costs continue to climb

This will undoubtedly be a shock to most contractors, but a recent study has shown that engineering and construction costs rose for the 8th consecutive month in June. This is according to IHS Markit and the Procurement Executives Group.

Highlights of the study show that:

- Copper prices have increased for the past year, especially in both May and June
- The cost of electrical equipment and transformers remained high in June as demand for semiconductors outpaced available supply.
- Labor costs continued to climb for the 5th straight month, in both the U.S. and Canada.

The exception is lumber, where prices dove more than 40% in June and is down more than 18% overall in 2021. The peak price was May 7th when lumber prices hit an all-time high of \$1670 per thousand board feet, which was more than six times higher that their pandemic low in April, 2020, according to our friends at the Sacramento Regional Builders Exchange.

Expect building permit process delays through the summer, according to the City of Santa Rosa

In a recent newsletter, the City of Santa Rosa says that due to a higher-than-normal workload, the community should expect delays in permit processing this summer.

The City can no longer guarantee five, ten, or 15-day turnarounds due to a high number of inspections for new development. Another cause is the expiration of the City's third-party contract which previously augmented staffing for the Resilient City Rebuild Center. Current lead times are 10 business days.

To request a quicker building plan review or building inspection through a third party, individuals may utilize the City's available for and guidelines to start that process.


While Mark Twain may or may not be the author of the "water is for fighting over" phrase, the sentiment still rings true in California. And with the drought worsening, we can expect more fights over water in our future. In addition to dealing with the need to conserve water and increase water supply, there are two water-related issues before us now that need attention. The first is the use of water capacity as a way to stop new development. And the second is the threat to keeping water in the North Bay in the North Bay.

But first, a little perspective. The California Water Foundation's Aquapedia describes the fight over water well. "California will always be inextricably linked to its water resources. Water continues to shape the state's development and no resource is as vital to California's urban centers, farms, industry, recreation, scenic beauty and environmental preservation."

"California's economy and culture have always been shaped by the abundance or scarcity of water. The Golden State's economy, agricultural production, and population have grown to number one in the nation, largely in pace with the development of its water resources. California receives 75 percent of its rain and snow in the watersheds north of Sacramento. However, 80 percent of California's water demand comes from the southern 2/3 of the state. And that equation is one that continues to cause controversy and strife."

The Aquapedia says, "The most basic issues affecting California's water supply center on distributing and sharing the resource — getting the water to the right place at the right time — while also not harming the environment and aquatic species. Distribution is also coupled with conflicts between competing interests over the use of available supplies."

"But moving water over great distances has created intense regional rivalries. Water feuds historically have

divided the state, pitting north against south, east against west and three major stakeholders (agricultural, urban and environmental) against one another. Intense disagreements persist over the manner in which California's water resources are developed and managed," according to the Aquapedia.

Moving the water has created a heavily engineered water system. Aquapedia says, "These geographic disparities have been remedied, in large part, by building one of the most complex and sophisticated flood management, water storage and water transport systems in the world. An integrated system of federal, state and locally owned dams, reservoirs, pumping plants and aqueducts transports large portions of the state's surface water hundreds of miles."


The state water system is also being impacted by the effects of climate change. Scientists predict increased

temperatures, less snow, earlier snowmelt and a rise in sea level which will have major implications for water supply, flood management and ecosystem health.

Water districts should have learned from the last drought how to be better prepared for the next one. Steps should have been taken to incentivize conservation, increase water recycling and reuse, capture more storm water, fix leaking pipes in the system, and generate more supply like from desalination. Instead, some water districts like Marin Municipal Water District (MMWD) are leaping to declare water hook-up moratoriums to stop new construction. This is a short-sighted and ineffectual response.

Housing is a crisis in the North Bay. We have a huge need to build more housing and because we haven't built anywhere near the amount we should, the costs of housing have skyrocketed, pushing many of Marin's workforce far from the county in which they work. Now we are experiencing a worker shortage, which is growing as we shrink our workforce due to the lack of housing. This

is unsustainable and will wreak havoc on our slowing recovering economy.

Emma Talley writes in Could California's drought crisis block Bay Area housing?, "Restrictions on housing production in the form of service hookups could strain the market in Marin, making it even more unaffordable. Tom Lai, director of the Marin County Community Development Agency, said if the area cannot meet its state mandates for permitting new housing, the deficit could also perpetuate racial inequalities with respect to where housing is located, what types of housing are available, and who lives in that housing."


Talley says, "In Lai's opinion, an outright ban on all new service connections for an extended time would be shortsighted. I would urge those making decisions to ban new hookups to look holistically at the problem,' he said, including reevaluating existing and new conservation programs."

"As housing experts point out, new construction is quite water efficient and water hook-up moratoriums won't solve supply concerns, says Talley." 'There are so many other options that we can consider, said Newsha Ajami, director of urban water policy with Stanford University's Water in the West program. She explained it's much better to think more strategically about how we want to be more water conscious and have a smaller water footprint."

While "there's always this tension between development and water use," Ajami advocates for connecting land-use planning and water-use planning, explaining that often the two are considered separately. She said when considering new developments, cities should focus on building structures that are "much more efficient in the way they use water."

Southern California has invested more than \$1 billion in new storage infrastructure since the early 2000s. Yet the recent storage expansion in the south is unmatched in the historically wetter north, Ajami said. "They've done a lot

more to diversify and save water compared to some other communities across the state," she said. "It shows that when you're under constant stress, you respond."

In Facing Drought, Southern California Has More Water Than Ever by Laura Bliss, she says "Investments in water recycling, desalination and stormwater capture have also made a difference. The city does not expect to ask residents to ration supplies this year or the next, said Delon Kwan, assistant director of water resources at the L.A. Department of Water and Power, because Southern California has a record 3.2 million acre-feet of water in reserve, enough to quench the population's needs this year and into the next."

But those actions do not preclude Southern California's lopsided population being in a different place as the drought continues and climate change intensifies. It is alarming that MMWD is pursuing repeating the solution they found in the desperate times of the 1977 drought – running a pipeline over the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge to bring in water from the East Bay. There are many reasons why that solution is not the right solution in 2021 but the biggest reason is the danger of that pipeline providing access by Southern California to our water supply in the North Bay. Pipes flow in two directions and what is painted as our salvation today could be our doom tomorrow.

It would be far wiser to pursue other solutions such as more recycling or reuse, stormwater capture, and desalination that will provide supply that is under the local control. "Demand management is the best and cheapest way we can approach water security," Ajami said. "There is no supply in California that is not vulnerable."

Are you up to speed on the latest employment updates?


With all of the bills the California Legislature passed in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, plus numerous agency regulations and guidance, it's difficult to stay up to date on employment laws. Join us at our Mid Year Labor Law Update for a complete rundown. Here's a taste of what you need to know about:

Supplemental Paid Sick Leave (SB 95): If you have more than 25 employees, then you must provide your California employees up to 80 hours of COVID-related paid sick leave for 2021. Employees have a right to use SPSL before other accrued leave, such as regular paid sick leave. You must indicate how many SPSL hours are available on the employee's paystub or separate writing. There is also a poster requirement. If you also offer FFCRA leave (the voluntary federal version), there is an opportunity for a tax credit!

Vaccination Guidance: The DFEH guidance states that employers can mandate the COVID-19 vaccine. This requirement will be subject to reasonable accommodations for

employees with disabilities/medical conditions and sincerely held religious beliefs. If administered onsite, the employer may ask pre-screening vaccination questions that are job-related and consistent with business necessity. If the employee is vaccinated by a third-party, the employer can require proof (i.e., vaccination card). If you mandate the vaccine, you must pay for all associated costs, such as time spent waiting to take it, travel/mileage reimbursement, etc.

Right to Recall Requirements (SB 93): Under SB 93, if you are hiring and in the hotel, private clubs, event centers, airport hospitality, airport service, or building services (janitorial, building maintenance, or security services), you must offer available positions in writing to certain employees who were laid-off due to COVID-19, before hiring others. There are specific timing and record retention requirements. Several municipalities passed right to recall ordinances with their own specific requirements. In addition to travel and hospitality industries, some of these ordinances cover large employers, restaurant workers, and those in entertainment.



Heat illness prevention

The Dog Days of Summer are upon us and with them comes another concern for California's employers: Heat Illness Prevention. California was the first state in the nation to put protections in place when Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger enacted heat-illness prevention laws in 2005 and since then other states have followed suit.

Industries & Warning Signs

Agriculture is usually the first industry that comes to mind when discussing Heat Illness Prevention Programs (HIPP's). Peak harvest seasons usually coincides with the warmest time of the year. This short window brings high production demands along with the opportunity working extended hours. This combination can be especially dangerous and the reason why many of the incidents reported in the media come from the agricultural industry.

Other industries that the order applies to are:

Construction

Landscaping

Oil and gas extraction

Transportation or delivery of agricultural products, construction or other heavy material (except for employment that consists of operating an air conditioned vehicle and does not include loading and unloading).

Direct exposure to the elements and working in locations without climate controls increase the risk of heat illness. Like agriculture, the construction and landscaping

industries usually see an increase in their workload during the warmer times of the year placing workers at risk. There are two types of heat illness you should be aware of:

Heat Exhaustion: Heat exhaustion happens when a person cannot sweat enough to cool their body. This is usually the result of not drinking enough fluids during hot temperatures.

Heatstroke: Heatstroke is the result of untreated heat exhaustion and is a serious medical emergency. You should seek immediate medical treatment.

Early symptoms of heat illness can include dizziness, nausea/vomiting, confusion, cramps, red dry skin, elevated heart rate and convulsions or fainting. If early signs are not detected and proper treatment is administered it can lead to brain damage as well as damage to other organs or death.

Requirements

If you have any employees that perform work in any of the industries listed above or if you have moved operations outdoors as a result of Covid-19 you are required to take the following 4 steps to prevent heat illness:

Training: all employees and supervisors must be trained about heat illness prevention.

Water: employers must provide enough fresh water so that each employee can drink at least 1 quart per hour and encourage them to do so.

Shade: employers must provide access to shade and encourage employees to take cool-down rest in the shade for at least 5 minutes.

Planning: employers must develop and implement written procedures for complying with the Cal/OSHA Heat Illness Prevention Standard.

In recent years violations related to Heat Illness Prevention have been one of Cal/OSHA's top 5 most cited.



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Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors

Let's start with a 'highlight' on solar. Point the way for an out-of-state contractor on CA fingerprinting rules, sort an 'unlikely event' if you don't pass your License Exams the first, second or tenth time you go for them ...

Q: We are in discussions regarding taking on some solar projects in Southern California. Initially, the contract will be for our company to consult on several new housing developments where we will be measuring and designing solar panel systems for the residential roofs. Eventually, down the line, we anticipate getting hired to install the systems, but for the initial consultation, measurements, and design, is a Contractor's License required?

A: No. A Contractor's License will definitely be required though when you are signing contracts or bidding on the installation of solar panel systems.

Q: We spoke last week and the information you provided for obtaining a new license was very helpful,

thank you again. You had mentioned "everyone listed on the application needed to be fingerprinted". Does that mean the Officers also need to be fingerprinted, or only our Responsible Managing Employee (RME)? If the answer is yes, do we all need to go to CA to have our fingerprints done? Or are we able to go to a facility here and have the data sent to the appropriate agency in CA? Assuming the answer to Question 1 is yes and the Officers cannot travel to CA, can we get the fingerprints done now, or are we required to wait until some point in the process before we can get them done locally here is MA? Lastly, can the fingerprints be done anywhere in California, or is it only Sacramento?

A: The RME, and all personnel listed on the license application (Officers, Members, etc.) will be required to get fingerprinted. While it is not required for the fingerprints to be completed in CA, it will cause a delay in the licensing process (weeks and sometimes months) if they are done outside of CA. Prints completed in CA are electronically sent to the DOJ/FBI/CSLB and are processed much more quickly than the prints done outside

of CA, which are hard copy rolled fingerprints which must be run manually. Either way, you must wait for the CSLB to send you the forms to take with you to get fingerprinted, you cannot complete the requirement ahead of time. There are over 300 Live Scan facilities in California, and they can be done at any of the locations.

Q: Can our company ask one of our Company Directors to act as the Responsible Managing Officer (RMO) for our license? Note, this person is not an "employee" of the company, but a Board Director.

A: As long as the individual can document the required experience and pass the exams. Note, the Qualifying Individual must be directly involved in the Company and overseeing its Contracting activities.


Q: I have a test date coming up for the "A" (General Engineering) and Law exams. In the unlikely event I do not pass (or if I pass one and not the other), when would I be able to sit for a retest?

A: If you do not pass one or both, you are required to wait three weeks to re-take the exam(s). The CSLB allows you to take the exams as many times as you need within eighteen months. If you do not pass within that time (as

you said, unlikely event), you are required to withdraw your application and start over.

Certification requirements for performing mechanical systems acceptance tests

By Contractor State License Board

The mandatory requirement that any person performing a mechanical systems acceptance test in a nonresidential building must be certified as an acceptance test technician (ATT) by an acceptance test technician certification provider (ATTCP) took effect on April 14, 2021. The mechanical systems ATT requirement is part of the Building Energy Efficiency Standards (Energy Code) Section 10-103.2. To allow a reasonable time for training and implementation of additional acceptance test technicians, the California Energy Commission (CEC) expects authorities having jurisdiction (AHJ) to enforce the mechanical systems ATT requirements to all nonresidential permit applications submitted on or after October 1, 2021.

Additionally, an ATT certification has been required to perform the lighting controls acceptance tests in compliance with the Energy Code for all newly installed or modified lighting controls in nonresidential buildings since July 2014.

Certification:

The minimum requirements for ATT certification eligibility are as follows:

Three years minimum installation or design experience

A member of one of the following industry groups:

Mechanical Systems:

- i. HVAC Installers
- ii. Mechanical Systems Contractors
- iii. Testing and Balancing Certified Technicians
- iv. Professional Engineers
- v. Licensed Architects
- vi. Controls Installation and start-up contractors
- vii. Certified Commissioning Professionals

On April 14, 2021, the CEC approved the enforcement of requirements that are intended to help contractors and building inspectors deliver on energy efficiency projections for newly installed heating, ventilating, and air conditioning equipment. The CEC established October 1, 2021, as the enforcement date for the new requirements for all new project permits.

Under the 2013 Energy Code, the CEC developed a program to help improve compliance with the mechanical

systems and lighting controls acceptance test requirements. The ATTCP program provides training, certification, and oversight of ATTs who perform the acceptance tests required by the Energy Code, as well as the Acceptance Test Employers (ATEs) that employ ATTs. ATTCPs are professional organizations that are approved by the CEC to provide training curriculum for ATTs and ATEs, certification procedures, compliant resolution (including disciplinary procedures), quality assurance, and accountability measures.

While the Lighting Controls ATTCP certification has been required since July 2014, it is only recently the CEC determined that the Mechanical Systems ATTCP certification will be enforced, having met the regulatory threshold, and set the recommended enforcement date to October 1, 2021, for all newly issued permits.

Outreach and Education

CEC staff is offering a one-hour course as an introduction to the ATTCP program and the certified ATT requirements for lighting controls and mechanical systems. Topics that will be addressed include – why acceptance testing is required in the Energy Code, what role the ATTCP program plays, recent actions by the CEC that make mechanical systems ATT certification mandatory, and how contractors and inspectors can use the program to their best advantage. The intent of this course is to provide a basic understanding of the responsibilities and benefits to the builder, contractor, ATT, and the building inspector.

As a result of attending this course:

Builders and contractors will learn the following:

How the ATTCP program can effectively demonstrate compliance with the Energy Code and streamline the inspection process with the AHJ.

Steps the contractor needs to take to secure an ATT certification.

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
