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OSHA responds to 'alarming' increase in trench deaths

- In response to an “alarming” increase in trench-related fatalities, OSHA has launched an enhanced enforcement initiative to protect workers from the hazard, the Department of Labor organization announced.
- In the first six months of 2022, 22 workers died from hazards in trench and excavation work, according to OSHA. That surpassed the 15 that perished in all of 2021.
- OSHA said it would consider various enforcement tools, including adding emphasis for how officials evaluate penalties, and criminal referrals for federal or state prosecution to hold employers or others accountable for putting workers' lives at risk.

Dive Insight:

OSHA highlighted a June 28 incident as an impetus for its decision. In Jarrell, Texas, two workers, aged

20 and 39, died when the 20-foot trench they worked in collapsed on them. Shields to reinforce their trench could have saved their lives. They sat unused beside the excavation, OSHA said.

“In a matter of seconds, workers can be crushed and buried under thousands of pounds of soil and rocks in an unsafe trench. The alarming increase in the number of workers needlessly dying and suffering serious injuries in trenching incidents must be stopped,” said Doug Parker, assistant secretary for Occupational Safety and Health.

The push for criminal referrals echoes a bill — dubbed “Carlos’ Law” — which recently made it to the desk of New York Gov. Kathy Hochul. The bill, named after a worker who died in an improperly reinforced trench seven years ago, would elevate the minimum fines to \$500,000 for those charged with a felony and found criminally responsible in such incidents.

“Every one of these tragedies could have been prevented had employers complied with OSHA standards,” Parker said. “There simply is no excuse for ignoring safety requirements to prevent trench

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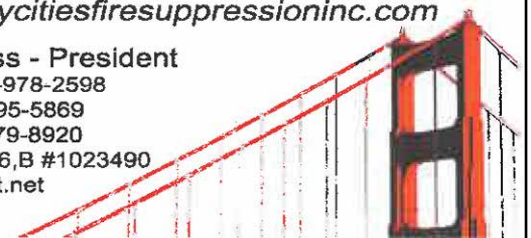
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Companies Worry about Effect of Inflation on Employees' Well-Being

While many Americans are worried about the high rate of inflation, companies are also worried, albeit for a different reason.

A study released on July 12 from the Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM) Research Institute found that almost 73% of HR professionals reported similar concerns among their organizations—with the highest concentration being found in the industries of agriculture (97%), wholesale trade (95%), utilities and energy (82%), and manufacturing (82%).

“Employers recognize that inflation has a major impact on the well-being of their team,” said Johnny C. Taylor, Jr., SHRM CEO in a statement. “In fact, SHRM research found that 87% of those worried about inflation said their highest concern was the effect on the lives of their employees. But there is no

one-size-fits-all approach to how organizations are handling the situation. While some employers are re-examining their strategy when it comes to pay, many others are unsure or not currently considering inflation as a factor in their annual pay raises, instead focusing on pay transparency, competitive compensation as well as the overall employee experience.”

HR professionals reported their organizations’ plans for factoring in inflation when granting annual pay raises for 2022. Though the lives of their employees were cited as their greatest concern, more than half of the participants surveyed are either not considering inflation (26%) or are not sure if inflation will be factored into annual pay raises (2%).

Of those who were aware of their organizations’ plans for annual pay raises, 63 percent reported that

inflation is being considered or accounted for in annual pay raises.

Other Key Findings

Concerns about inflation varied by organization size, with HR professionals in smaller organizations being more likely to be concerned:

81% of HR professionals in small organizations (less than 100 employees).

74% of HR professionals in medium organizations (100-499 employees).

67% of HR professionals in large organizations (500 or more employees).

Of those who indicated inflation was a concern at their organization, the highest concern was with how inflation would affect the lives of their employees:

87%: the lives of our employees.

70 %: customers and consumers.

61% suppliers and wholesale costs.

Small organizations were much more likely than large organizations to consider inflation for annual pay raises. Of the HR professionals who were aware of their companies' plans and reported that inflation is being considered in annual pay raises or accounted for based on standard cost of living adjustments:

76% were from small organizations

65% were from medium organizations

54% were from large organizations


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More North Bay governments consider banning natural gas in new construction

As the Marin County grand jury leans into a world where greenhouse gas reduction goals are met by banning natural gas use in new building construction, some building trade groups say the idea doesn't meet the real-world test.

"A major issue is power backup in the event of outages," said Craig Lawson, immediate past president of CAL Custom Building Services Inc. "If electricity is the only future source, what happens when it fails during rolling blackouts or due to other causes for long periods of time. Even with solar battery storage systems, the average length of time backup power is available is around two days. The goal of having net zero emissions will never be (met) 100%, in my opinion."

He added the call for any recommended or mandated all-electric building code "comes at a time when the state is working with an antiquated grid that depends on natural gas for almost half of its power generation."

As the Journal reported, the Marin County civil grand jury on June 6 recommended reducing climate changing greenhouse gases by eliminating natural gas as an energy source for new building construction, along with the replacement of gas appliances and equipment within existing structures when outdated or nonfunctioning.

The 2022 California Building Standards Code (Title 24), detailing the path toward electrifying the state, was published July 1. This building code update will become effective Jan. 1, 2023, meaning that all new residential and commercial buildings must be built electric-ready.

In the interim, local jurisdictions have been meeting for months to review model building codes and decide whether to adopt more restrictive "reach codes" and take actions, such as banning the use of natural gas in newly constructed buildings.

Reach codes are local building ordinances that can take effect within the state building code's three-year revision cycle. They must be cost-effective, as stringent as the statewide code, approved by the California Energy Commission (CEC) and re-approved when the California energy code is updated, or they will expire.

Other questions raised by the Marin civil grand jury include the best way to take the all-electric concept into existing homes and those undergoing renovations and to large multi-unit residential buildings.

The report asks, "Can consumers be incentivized to voluntarily replace gas-fueled appliances with electric ones?"

Currently, more than 50 local jurisdictions throughout California have adopted codes that reach beyond state minimum requirements for energy use in building design and construction. Some jurisdictions in the North Bay have moved to ban natural gas, though in some cities, like Windsor and Santa Rosa, that triggered lawsuits.

So far within Marin County, Fairfax is the only city to have adopted an all-electric requirement for new buildings. Within Santa Clara and San Mateo counties, 20 cities have adopted their own building electrification reach codes.

'Must be prepared and become more resilient'

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More North Bay governments consider banning natural gas in new construction

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In Sonoma County, Supervisor Susan Gorin said, “During the fires, we lost some 6,000 homes and when rebuilding we must embrace renewable energy using the latest technologies and by building all-electric homes. With regards to electric shutdowns, everyone is concerned about saving energy and having a consistent supply. We must be prepared and become more resilient.”

She said the county has not yet decided to establish reach codes, and even if it did, implementation would take time.

“We must be realistic by not requiring every home or car to be all-electric to address climate change,” Gorin said.

Tanya Narath, director of climate programs for the Regional Climate Protection Authority (RCPA) in Sonoma County, said the organization is looking at costs and time frames, along with environmental justice and equity issues.

“We’re mobilizing climate protection efforts with the

goal of how to make the transition to increasing energy efficiency by sealing the home envelope by weather proofing, etc., while also collaborating with an ad-hoc group studying ways to raise funds for climate efforts,” Narath said.

She said Healdsburg and Santa Rosa have all-electric reach codes, but Healdsburg has two exemptions (see the sidebar with this story). Petaluma is updating its own municipal code to ban gas in new construction.

Windsor’s all-electric reach code was reversed due to the possibility of litigation, and Sebastopol’s Climate Action Committee is evaluating whether to establish such a code.

The cities of Sonoma, Cotati, Cloverdale and Rohnert Park have not announced new local building ordinances to date.

Matt Brown, communications specialist with the Sonoma County Administrator’s Office, said the county is focusing on promoting micro-grids.

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“Currently, the Sonoma County Emergency Independence Program provides financing that can help fund the installation of micro-grids and certain energy-efficiency programs,” Brown said. “In addition, the county’s Energy and Sustainability Division makes incentives available for appliance efficiency upgrades, and Sonoma Clean Power has launched promotions to offset costs associated with switching to all-electric appliances.”

Napa County takes a regional approach

Deborah Elliott, Napa County environmental resource specialist and sustainability planner, said the focus is on climate action for the entire county, and that no local jurisdictions — to her knowledge — are making building code changes at this time.

“In early spring, we reached out to planning directors and met with them monthly to discuss this issue. For now, our jurisdictions are working together with the Climate Action Committee to develop a plan for moving forward.”

Marin is cautioned about ‘creating a ban without a plan’

In March 2021, the Marin Builders Association board of directors issued a policy statement saying that “a ban on natural gas to residences will increase construction costs, decrease consumer choice, reduce energy availability for homeowners during Public Safety Power Shutoff periods, potentially cause unforeseen impacts to the electrical grid, increase energy costs for homeowners, and have minimal impact on the overall reduction of greenhouse gas emissions.”

The association’s policy stated, “Creating a ban without a plan is not effective or fair policy development.”

However, the association “supports the development of credits, incentives and rebates to encourage less reliance on natural gas. Homeowners will make changes only if they are financially motivated and there is viable consumer choice.”

The trade group’s board of directors said the implementation of a code change that eliminates natural gas

would increase costs from project development to end-users.

“We suggest any governing body interested in adopting a ban on the use of natural gas first create a committee of environmental experts, impacted homeowners, and building professionals to explore the true impacts of such policy as well as a plan with viable solutions, staging the eventual phasing-out of natural gas over a defined period of time,” the policy stated.

Concern about the cost of affordable housing

Lisa Wittke Schaffner, CEO of the North Coast Builders Exchange, with over 900 members, pointed to limitations of the Marin report.

“Civil grand juries do not set policy, they just make recommendations that can help shape the political will of California’s counties, cities and towns,” said the leader of the trade group. “Before jurisdictions do anything, an assessment should be made of the fiscal impact of a natural gas ban on building affordable homes where margins for builders are not big.”

She noted that analysis should consider that new homes

are built to be more energy efficient and how appliances are actually used.

“Such assessments should determine how many minutes a day hot water heaters or stovetop gas burners are in use,” Wittke Schaffner said.

The cost of new homes after gas bans could be an issue, according to Mike Behler, president of Behler Construction Company and board chair of the builders exchange. He owns a vacation home with a gas water heater and a backup generator fueled by propane.

“It is definitely not cheaper to build all-electric homes,” Behler said. “Many people prefer to work with gas. Those proposing or adopting reach codes are over-reaching, in my view.”

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Apprentice Safety

Apprenticeships are used in a variety of industries to train people on all aspects of their job. Due to apprentices being new to their profession, they tend to be learning about the dangers associated with their chosen profession while on the job. In this lesson we will cover some common hazards that apprentices may be exposed to, personal protective equipment, and safe work practices.

HAZARDS

With apprentices working in industries that range from construction to hairdressing, you could be exposed to a variety of hazards. Hazards may include, but not be limited to:

- Slipping, tripping, falling • Eye irritation or damage • Skin irritation or damage • Respiratory irritation or damage • Electric shock or electrocution • Burns • Exposure to inclement weather • Exposure to chemicals • Exposure to excessive noise • Musculoskeletal injuries • Cuts or lacerations • Pinch points (areas where long hair, loose

clothing, jewelry, and extremities can get caught) • Confined spaces • Moving vehicles or equipment

One way that you can minimize your chances of an accident occurring is by wearing the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE). PPE may include, but not be limited to:

- Safety glasses or goggles • Gloves • Non-slip shoes or boots • Steel-toed shoes or boots • Reflective vests or jackets • Fall harness • Respirator • Hearing protection • Protective clothing
- Inspect all provided PPE for wear or damage. If something is worn or damaged, report it to your supervisor. Do NOT wear damaged PPE. Additionally, if required by company policy or manufacturer recommendations, remove all jewelry and tie back long hair before putting on your PPE.

Since apprentices are new to their craft, and still learning valuable skills that can serve them well in the future, there are some safe work practices that you should remember:

- Follow all company policies and procedures for safety and health in the workplace. • Listen and follow the instructions that are given to you by your supervisor or a competent /qualified person. If you are unsure about something, ask questions for clarification. • Attend all scheduled trainings. If you are unsure about something that was mentioned during the training, ask questions for clarification. • Do NOT perform any work that you have not been trained to do. Trying to do a task without the proper training could lead to an injury or death. • Be aware of your surroundings. • Practice proper housekeeping to keep floors clear of slipping or tripping hazards and to help minimize other hazards that may be present in the workplace. • Use all tools and equipment in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. If you do not know how to operate or use something, ask for training. Do NOT use tools or equipment that you have not received training on. • Do NOT remove guards from tools and equipment.

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Apprentice Safety


Manufacturer-provided guards should be kept on all tools and equipment unless they are being repaired. Repairs should only be conducted by trained personnel. If you notice a guard missing, immediately notify your supervisor.

- Properly store tools and equipment when they are not being used. If you are unsure where something should go, ask your supervisor.
- Do NOT enter areas that require special authorization unless you have been given express permission.
- Become knowledgeable about the location of all first aid kits.
- Become familiar with typical hazards associated with the tasks. If something seems hazardous to you, report to your supervisor.
- Additionally, if applicable, become knowledgeable about all hazardous chemicals that you will work with, and the location of all safety data sheets (SDS). SDS will provide information on a chemical along with PPE that should be worn and safe handling and storage procedures. Do NOT work with chemicals unless you are wearing the appropriate PPE and have received the appropriate training.
- Where applicable, do NOT work at heights without the proper fall protection equipment.
- Where applicable, only drive vehicles that you have the appropriate license for and have been given permission to

drive. Some vehicles may require special training. If you are unsure about a vehicle, ask your supervisor.

- Know where all fire extinguishers are located either in buildings or in vehicles (if applicable).
- o NOT use a fire extinguisher unless you have been trained on how to use it. Remember that hazards that you could be exposed to will differ depending on your location and task. If you are uncertain about anything, always ask your supervisor for clarification. Tying to do something without the proper knowledge could cause you to get injured or worse.

To conclude, apprentices can play a big part in a business's operations because they are the next generation. However, it is important to remember that your seniors did not obtain all their knowledge in one night. Being unfamiliar with the hazards associated with the job could lead to injury or death if you do not practice the proper precautions. Remember to ask questions, attend all training, and do NOT perform tasks in which you have not received training.



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Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors

When can you wave goodbye to a 'Qualifier' in Arizona? Another contractor hopes that when he gets a promotion to Officer it's as a 'General'. I also show why having an expert on tap saves contractors and attorneys time and money when dealing with complex rules and regulations...

Q: I am the RMO for my company and have a "C-27" (Landscaping) and "C-8" (Concrete) classification. I have been asked to become an Officer of another company that has a "A" (General Engineering) and "B" (General Building) licenses. Once I am listed as an Officer with the other company can I add the "A" and "B" license to my company that I am the RMO for without taking the tests?

A: No, you cannot automatically add the "A" and "B" to your license and Waive the exams. After being an Officer on a license for over five years you can apply to replace the Qualifier on that same license, but you cannot automatically go add the classifications to a different license.

Q: How long does a company have to replace a Qualifier in AZ, and how long until a company can apply to Waive the requirement to have a Qualifier?

A: Once a Qualifier disassociates from your AZ license, you have 60 days to replace the individual on the license. Once the company is licensed for a period of five years in good standing with no complaints and there hasn't been more than 50% of ownership transfer, the Company can apply to be exempt from having a Qualifying Party.

Q: I am an attorney and one of my contractor clients is in a dispute that may result in some legal action. The contractor

has several “D”-category classifications. We are trying to get an idea of what type of work the Company communicated to the CSLB they would be doing. Is there a way to obtain a copy of the original application that was submitted where the type of work being done would have been described?

A: You can request copies of the CSLB file, which if specified, can include the original application submitted. The original application would likely have the qualifier’s Certification of Work Experience detailing the type of work he/she does and the CSLB used that description to determine if they qualify for a particular license.

Q: Does the CSLB ever expedite applications? Can we pay extra?

A: The CSLB does not have an option to pay extra to have your application expedited. Military Veterans or spouses can receive expedited processing, and so can Refugees and individuals with special immigrant Visas. As far as any other applicants, expedite requests are reviewed on a case by case basis and only under very few and far between circumstances are expedite requests approved.

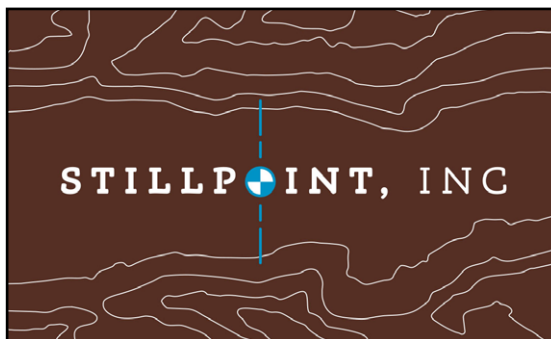
