
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ANAPHYLACTIC SHOCK - Signs, Symptoms, Solutions

Anaphylactic shock, or anaphylaxis, can be a life-threatening event. Anaphylactic shock can be brought on by many different allergens. An employee can start to show signs of anaphylactic shock within minutes of exposure to an allergen.

WHAT IS ANAPHYLACTIC SHOCK?

Anaphylactic shock is a severe reaction to an allergen. When an allergen enters the body through skin contact, ingestion, medications, or inhalation, certain cells of the body will release histamine. Histamine will then enter other parts of the body. When histamine enters the body it can lower blood pressure, make breathing difficult, and cause swelling around or at the site of contact.

SYMPTOMS OF ANAPHYLACTIC SHOCK

After exposure to an allergen, people can start to show symptoms of anaphylactic shock within minutes. Symptoms will vary between people. Symptoms may include: • Hives • Feeling itchy • Redness of the skin • Flushing or paleness of the skin • Swelling of the lips or tongue • Difficulty breathing • Tight feeling in the chest • Coughing or wheezing • Lowered blood pressure NOTE: Times can vary between exposure and symptoms. It might take up to four hours for symptoms of anaphylactic shock to appear after a person has been exposed to an allergen.

ALLERGENS THAT CAN CAUSE ANAPHYLACTIC SHOCK

• Food allergies (peanuts, tree nuts, shellfish, wheat, etc.) • Stings (bees, wasps, fire ants, etc.) • Pollens • Dust • Latex • Animal dander • Medications NOTE: Exercise can sometimes cause anaphylactic shock.

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF SOMEONE IS EXPERIENCING ANAPHYLACTIC SHOCK?

When you see someone who is showing symptoms of anaphylactic shock, you should: • Remain calm.

• Have someone call 911. o While waiting for emergency services, have someone trained in first aid or a nurse come and offer additional aid (if applicable). • Have another person go inform your supervisor or manager. • Have the person sit or lay down, whichever is the most comfortable position for them. • Have the person use their epinephrine auto-injector (if applicable). o Ensure that the used epinephrine auto-injector is properly disposed of after use. It should be put in a sharps container. o Note the time that the injection was given. Give this information to the Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) when they arrive. • Should a person not have an epinephrine auto-injector, you should: o Have the person sit back in a chair or lie down, whichever position they find the most comfortable. o Loosen tight clothing. o Cover the person with blanket (if applicable). o If the person starts to bleed from the mouth or vomit turn them onto their side to prevent choking. o If there is no sign of breathing, a person trained in CPR should perform CPR until emergency services arrive. • When emergency services arrive, give the EMTs as much information as you can, especially in cases when the person cannot provide information themselves. • Report to your supervisor and give as much information as you can about the incident.

CONCLUSION

Anaphylactic shock can affect everyone and symptoms can show up within minutes or hours later. The most important thing to remember when helping someone who is experiencing anaphylactic shock is not to delay treatment. Delaying treatment could lead to more severe health complications and in some cases death.



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ANTIFREEZE SPILLS - Reducing Hazards

Antifreeze is used by many industries and companies to keep liquids from freezing in cold temperatures and to keep engines from overheating. Antifreeze is poisonous to animals and people when ingested, so a spill or leak can be extremely dangerous to both employees and the public if it is not cleaned up properly. Following the safe work practices provided in this lesson will help ensure employee safety.

HAZARDS

When antifreeze spills or leaks, it can potentially expose employees to hazards, including:

• Poisoning (if ingested) • Eye irritation or damage • Lung irritation (when exposed to over long periods of time or in large quantities) • Irritation of the skin • Water contamination (when it goes down drains) • Slipping


PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

Employees should wear the following personal protective equipment: • Rubber gloves • Proper footwear • Goggles (optional or when required)

SAFE WORK PRACTICES

Antifreeze should be treated with care when it is not being used. Employees should do the following to prevent leaks or spills from occurring: • Inspect the antifreeze packaging for damage. If the container has damage that could result in a leak, the liquid should be moved to an appropriate container and labeled with the product information. Report any damaged container to your supervisor. • Ensure that antifreeze is being stored properly. • Check the container lid to ensure that is has been tightly secured. • Do NOT store antifreeze in an

area in which it could be knocked over. • Do NOT store antifreeze in an area in which the container could become wet. Antifreeze containers should be kept dry at all times. When an accidental spill or leak occurs, an employee should clean it up immediately. Employees should do the following when cleaning up antifreeze: • Consult the Safety Data Sheet (SDS) for required materials needed based on the size of the spill. • Prior to cleaning up the spill, you should put on the proper personal protective equipment (PPE). Check all PPE for damage before putting it on. Report any damaged PPE to your supervisor. • Based on the size of the spill, you may be required to block the area off from customers and other employees to prevent the spill from spreading and accidental injuries. • Find the source of the leak and stop it. • Check to see if any of the antifreeze went down a drain. If it appears to have gone down a drain, inform your supervisor as soon as possible as the EPA may need to be contacted. • Use the appropriate absorbent material or designated mop to

clean up the spill or leak. • Ensure that the cleaned-up antifreeze or absorbent material is recycled or disposed of in the appropriate container. • Report the leak or spill to your supervisor. Ensure that you include the size of the spill in your report as the cleaned material may need to be disposed of by a professional. • In the event that antifreeze comes into contact with your skin, wash the area with soap and water.

CONCLUSION

Antifreeze can be a dangerous substance when it is not handled properly and spills and leaks should be cleaned up immediately. This is to ensure that antifreeze does not make its way to a drain and to prevent injuries from people slipping on the substance. Cleaning up spills or leaks that occur outside will also help in the protection of wild and domestic animals. Employees can minimize the dangers of leaked or spilled antifreeze by utilizing the safe work practices provided in this lesson.

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BOOM LIFT SAFETY - Share with your team on the jobsite the help reduce accidents

Boom lifts are useful machines that make working on jobs with heights much easier. However, just like with all machines that create convenience, the boom lift presents hazards. As long as you use common sense, follow the operator's manual, and remember the following tips, you can remain safe while operating the boom lift.

HAZARDS AND HOW TO AVOID THEM

• Electrical Hazards: Working at heights increases the possibility of coming into contact with electrical lines. o Try to stay away from electrical lines. o If you must work near electrical lines, try to get the lines shut off for the period of time you need to work in the area. o Know what to do if the boom lift gets tangled in electrical lines. • Overturning: If the bucket or platform is loaded beyond capacity or if the lift is parked on an incline that is too steep, the boom lift could fall over. o Always follow the load capacity warnings from the warning stickers or the operator's manual. o Remember to take into account the weight of the people, tools, and other equipment when you use a boom lift. • Falling: Work at heights always brings with it the dangers of falling. Always wear the proper fall protection. • Pinch Points: There are many pinch points in a boom lift, including the hinges as the boom extends or retracts. o Be aware of your surroundings. o Avoid working too near pinch points. o Be sure all safety guards and devices are in place before you use the boom lift. • Falling Objects: There is always the risk of things falling from the boom lift onto bystanders below, as well as objects falling from the other surroundings into the boom lift. o Always wear a hard hat. o Do not walk under the bucket or platform. Set up barriers or warning tape to keep

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FALL PROTECTION

• Always wear your fall protection. • Inspect your fall protection for fraying, rust, and anything else that could be wrong with it before you use it. o If there is something wrong, do not use it; instead, label the equipment and put it out of commission. • A lanyard must be connected to the belt or harness and attached to an anchor point on the bucket or platform. • Be sure you know how to use your fall protection properly before you actually use it.

BOOM LIFT SAFETY EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Sometimes accidents happen, and the boom lift can get tangled in scaffolds, trees, or other boom lifts. If this happens: • Stop using it. • Remove everyone from the bucket or platform. • Only try to free the boom if you know how. o Follow all instructions in the operator's manual. o Only use the ground controls; do not attempt to free the boom if you are still in the bucket or platform.

GENERAL PROCEDURES

- Inspect the machine before use- check for rust, cracks, chips, and make sure the warning stickers are all legible.
- Inspect the area you will be working in and be aware of any hazards present. Have a plan for what to do should you encounter any of those hazards. Keep unnecessary personnel away from the operations of the boom lift. Always read and understand the operator's manual before using the boom lift. Know the maximum intended load and load carrying capacity and respect it. Do not use the guardrails as a ladder. Never disable the safety devices and do not modify the machine.

STORAGE AND MAINTENANCE

When you are finished using the boom lift for the day:
• Drive the boom lift with the boom down for maximum visibility. • Do not drive the boom lift with someone in it. • Park the boom lift somewhere safe and out of the way. • Take the keys out or take other measures to insure unauthorized personnel do not use the boom lift. • Follow

the operator's manual to make sure all maintenance (such as oil changes and fuel refilling) is performed regularly.

CONCLUSION

In order to receive the benefits of using a boom lift without suffering from the hazards, be sure to follow the instruction manual, use common sense, and remember what you have learned about the safe operation of the machine.

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BULLYING IN THE WORKPLACE

Bullying in the workplace is an issue that is not always addressed directly because sometimes victims will switch departments, leave the company, or keep quiet about the harassment. Employees should be free from harassment of any kind while at work, and bullying will not be tolerated. The following information is to be used as a guide to educate employees on how to respond to workplace "bullies".

SIGNS OF BULLYING

Sometimes bullying, or psychological harassment, is subtle and difficult to distinguish between intentional or a simple personality clash. Some signs to look for if you suspect bullying in the workplace are: • You get extremely anxious on Sunday night before your work week – you may even throw up. • You seem to be constantly criticized despite putting forth your best efforts. • You have been insulted, yelled at, or humiliated at work - in front of others or alone. • A coworker seems to keep a mental record of your previous mistakes and often refers to them. • There have been rumors spread around the workplace about you. • You feel that you have been isolated or are often not invited to group lunches or meetings. • You feel drained or lifeless on

your days off, or you frequently take mental health days. • A coworker has done something that has directly affected your progress – e.g., sabotage. • There have been frequent last minute changes to your schedule or duties for no reason. • A coworker seems eager to take the credit for work you have done.


Bullying does NOT include the following:

• A difference of opinion. • Constructive feedback or workrelated advice. • A supervisor or employer assessing your work performance.

HOW TO RESPOND TO A BULLY

The worst response to somebody who you suspect is bullying you is retaliation. Attempting revenge will only make it easier for the tormenter to accuse YOU of being the bully. Appropriate actions to take are: • Firmly tell the tormenter to stop the unacceptable behavior. • Keep a record of all events that suggest psychological harassment in as much detail as possible. o Witness names, if any, are important and should be documented.

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BULLYING IN THE WORKPLACE

• Keep copies of any malicious letters, emails, or memos received. • Report the incident to your supervisor, or proceed to the next level of management if you suspect that your supervisor is the bully.

BULLYING WILL NOT BE TOLERATED

Psychological harassment of any kind is unacceptable and will result in an unhealthy workplace if continued. Possible effects of bullying may include: • Decreased production and morale. • Increased turnover or absences. • Increased cost for employee assistance programs and recruitment efforts. • Poor customer service.

CONCLUSION


If you suspect you are being bullied, it is imperative that



you take appropriate action. Do not retaliate, keep adequate records of the bullying history, and report to the proper authority so that the issue can be resolved as quickly as possible.









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
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
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




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
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
