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North Coast Builders Exchange Annual Golf Tournament

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Cal/OSHA Wildfire Smoke Standard (requirements)

California Code of Regulations, title 8, section 5141.1 applies to most outdoor workplaces where the current Air Quality Index (current AQI) for airborne particulate matter 2.5 micrometers or smaller (PM2.5) is 151 or greater, and where employers should reasonably anticipate that employees could be exposed to wildfire smoke.

Wildfire smoke is composed of harmful chemicals and tiny particles suspended in the air that present a significant health hazard for workers exposed to it. These particles can irritate the lungs and cause serious or even fatal health effects, such as:

• Reduced lung function, bronchitis, worsening of asthma, and heart failure

Which employers must comply with the regulation?

Employers with workplaces and operations must comply with the full standard when both of the following conditions apply:

• The current AQI for PM2.5 is 151 or greater, regardless of the AQI for other pollutants

• The employer should reasonably anticipate that employees may be exposed to wildfire smoke

Which employers are exempt from compliance with the regulation?

Employers with workplaces and operations in any of the following conditions are exempt from complying with section 5141.1:

• Enclosed buildings or structures in which the air is filtered by a mechanical ventilation system and the employer ensures that windows, doors, bays and other openings are kept closed, except when it is necessary to open doors to enter or exit.

• Enclosed vehicles in which the air is filtered by a cabin air filter and the employer ensures that windows, doors and other openings are kept closed, except when it is necessary to open doors to enter or exit the vehicle.

• The employer demonstrates that the concentration of PM2.5 in the air does not exceed a concentration that corresponds to a current AQI of 151 or greater by measuring PM2.5 levels at the worksite in accordance with Appendix A • Employees exposed to a current AQI for PM2.5 of 151 or greater for a total of one hour or less during a shift

Firefighters engaged in wildland firefighting

What does the regulation require?

Section 5141.1 created the following requirements for employers to protect workers from wildfire smoke:

1. Identification of Harmful Exposures (subsection c) – For worksites covered by the regulation, employers (with certain exceptions) must determine employee exposure to PM2.5 at the start of each shift and periodically thereafter, as needed.

2. Communication (subsection d) – Employers must implement a system for communicating wildfire smoke hazards in a language and manner readily understandable by employees.

3. Training and instruction information (subsection e and Appendix B) – For worksites covered by the regulation, employers must provide effective training that includes at least the information contained in Appendix B.

4. Control of harmful exposures to employees (subsection f) – With certain exceptions, employers must reduce workers' exposure to wildfire smoke in the following ways:

• If feasible, by providing an enclosed location with filtered air so that employee exposure to PM2.5 is less than a current AQI of 151, or to the extent feasible.

• If that is not feasible or adequate, by relocating to another outdoor location where the current AQI for PM2.5 is lower, changing work schedules, reducing work intensity, or providing more rest periods.

• With respiratory protective equipment if employers cannot reduce workers' exposure to PM2.5 to a current AQI of less than 151.

Where the current AQI for PM2.5 is from 151 to 500, employers must provide a sufficient number of NIOSH-approved particulate respirators, such as N95 masks, to all employees for voluntary use, and training on the regulation, the health effects of wildfire smoke, and the safe use and maintenance of respirators.

• Where the current AQI for PM2.5 is higher than 500, the employer must provide and require employees to use NIOSH-approved particulate respirators that will reduce employee exposure to PM2.5 to an equivalent of an AQI less than 151.

Cal/OSHA Wildfire Smoke Standard (requirements)

Determining Current AQI and PM2.5 levels

Employers may use the Air Quality Index or their own direct reading instruments to determine employee exposure to wildfire smoke.

The term "Current Air Quality Index" or (Current AQI) is the method used by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) to report air quality on a real-time basis. Current AQI is also referred to as the "NowCast," and represents data collected over time of varying length in order to reflect present conditions as accurately as possible.

Cal/OSHA Citations

Should you receive an OSHA enforcement visit, it will most likely result in one or more (usually more ...) citations. In the situations involving Wildfire Smoke issues, the visit will either have been initiated from a "complaint" or as part of Cal/OSHA's "sweep program" ("program inspections"). The following are several sections from the standard that are most likely to be used for issuing a citation(s). (d) Communication. As required by section 3203, the employer shall establish and implement a system for communicating wildfire smoke hazards in a language and manner readily understandable by employees, including provisions designed to encourage employees to inform the employer of wildfire smoke hazards at the worksite without fear of reprisal. The system shall include effective procedures for:

(1) Informing employees of:

(A) The current AQI for PM2.5 as identified in subsection (c); and

(B) Protective measures available to employees to reduce their wildfire smoke exposures.

(2) Encouraging employees to inform the employer if any of the following occurs:

(A) Worsening air quality.

(B) Adverse symptoms that may be the result of wildfire smoke exposure such as asthma attacks, difficulty breathing, and chest pain.

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PROTECTING WORKERS FROM EXPOSURE TO LOUD NOISE

Exposure to loud noise has long been considered a major occupational hazard in the construction industry. Occupational noise exposure can have a serious impact on hearing over time, often resulting in irreversible hearing loss if exposure to loud noise is not reduced through noise hazard control procedures. OSHA requires employers to implement a hearing conservation program when noise exposure is at or above 85 decibels averaged over 8 working hours, or an 8-hour timeweighted average (TWA).

How do you know if noise might be too loud?

- If you are unable to normally communicate with someone 3 feet away, noise levels might be over 85 decibels.
- If workers are experiencing ringing or humming in the ears or a temporary hearing loss at the end of a workday.

The NIOSH Sound Level Meter Application can help you measure noise levels. Download for free at www.cdc.gov/niosh/topics.

An effective hearing conservation program can help prevent initial occupational hearing loss, preserve and protect remaining hearing, and equip workers with the knowledge and hearing protection devices necessary to safeguard themselves.

Use this 3-step noise hazard control process to help lower noise levels:

- 1. **Reduce It:** Use the quietest equipment available, such as a smaller, quieter generator.
- 2. **Move It:** Move equipment farther away from workers. Noise levels go down as the distance from noisy equipment is increased.
- 3. **Block It:** Building temporary barriers of plywood or other on-site materials helps keep the noise from reaching workers..

Employers and workers need to work together to identify noise hazards, conduct hazard assessments and apply the 3-step control process as appropriate. Research indicates that worksites with appropriate and effective hearing conservation programs have higher levels of worker productivity and a lower incidence of absenteeism.

The OSHA #7400 Occupational Noise Exposure Hazards is a 1-day class that focuses on noise hazards in the workplace. Visit osha4you.com for more information.

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


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Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors

Time is everything for our first contractor whose out-of-state office was 'out of the loop'! Our second contractor has returned in the nick of time to keep his license before the first 'domino' also takes his down and when the clock starts for another his time is quickly running out! Don't let this happen to you...

Q: We have a CA Contractor's License and have several offices here in California, however the business mailing address on our license is a Florida address. Our Contractor's Bond renewal notification was sent to the Florida address, and the office there was unaware that we have ongoing projects still in California, and I just found out today that instead of renewing it, they cancelled it! Now our license is showing Suspended. How do I get this corrected and what implications may this have on the license status?

A: I looked up your license and the cancellation date of the bond luckily is still within the 90 days to get this corrected. Contact your bonding company to obtain a new Bond and request that they backdate the effective cancellation date. The CSLB will lift the Suspension retroactively to that date so there shouldn't be any break in the license.

Q: Our current Responsible Managing Employee (RME) gave his notice that he will be leaving our company to start his own business, so we need to replace him on our license. He has agreed to remain on the license until we replace him. We have a couple other candidates in mind. Is the best way to proceed to have everyone obtain their own personal license, or should we just have one of them apply outright to replace the current RME? I'm just wondering if filing the replacement application automatically starts the 90-day clock ticking. We don't want our license to lapse in the event our new person doesn't pass the exam!

A: Understandable! Filing the replacement application does not automatically start the 90-day clock. If your current Qualifier has agreed to stay on board until you replace him, there is a box you can check on the replacement application to not remove him/her until the new person is officially added to the license.

Q: We currently have a Joint Venture license with another Building contractor. A job has come up which we

want to bid on, however it requires both the "A" (General Engineering) and "B" (General Building) licenses. Assuming we need to add the "A" classification to the JV, correct? How long will that take and is there any possibility our Qualifier could waive the exam based on his experience?

A: Because neither of the Joint Venture entities currently hold the "A" classification, the individual with the requisite experience will need to add it to the Company license first before applying it to the Joint Venture license. Your Qualifier will not be able to waive the General Engineering exam based on experience alone so he will be required to take the exam. This will be a two-step process, first adding the classification to the Company license, and then once added, it can be applied to the JV license so you are looking at about two and a half months before the JV will be able to start work on that project.

Q: My uncle has a Sole Owner license, and he wants to help me eventually get my own license. He is moving out of California and wants me to take over his business, but he will still be "around" for consulting and such. He suggested that we add me to his license so that I can use it until I'm fully qualified and ready to get my own license. Is that the correct procedure?

A: Sole Proprietors cannot add people to their license, nor can you "use" his license. What the two of you may want to consider doing is forming an LLC or a Corporation, or even a Partnership where you both can be listed on the license with him acting as the qualifying individual. You can work under the Company license and eventually take it over when you are ready. If you go this route and want to operate as such for at least five years, you can then apply to become the qualifier and ask to waive the exams.

Q: My Dad passed away about two years ago. My Mom received his renewal application in the snail-mail and we realized his license is still Active which brought us to wonder whether I can take over the license. It is an older low number. I worked for him for many years prior to his passing and I've been working in the construction industry my whole life.

A: Unfortunately, it sounds like you waited too long. To request the Sole Owner license number be transferred, you would have had to ask for it within 90 days of your Dad's passing away. I'm sorry for your loss, call if I can assist you in getting your own license.

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

While most diets dietate what to est, intermittent fasting dietates when to est. Intermittent fasting is cycling between hours when you est and hours when you fast (refisin from food). The most common pattern is to fast for 16 hours, but you can est food for eight hours during an average day (the 16c8 method). Other plans include fasting for 24 hours more or twice a week (the cat-stop-est method).

Some studies have linked intermittent fasting to weight loss, but that's not a surprise. If you don't set for many hours, you'll est less overall, and that calorie reduction will lead to weight loss. But weight loss is not generated, especially in people who continually consume more calories than they need during the non-fasting hours.

Studies also link intermittant faiting to lower LDL. (harmful) chalasterol layels and reduced inflammation. And since there are no restricted finds, it's easy to follow.

But before you coulder intermittent finting, there are some downriden to note. Since it doesn't tell you what to est, you don't learn about matrixing food or healthy enting habits. And while some can fast intermittently long-term, others find they are langgy, diag, thed and groupy when they fast, and they have to stop.

Internitional facting is not recommended for people with a latency of enting disorders. And ensuch multion internations facing for people with type 2 dislates are usined. Some show lower transits levels, but others show people blood argue control and the side of hypoglycends. 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High-Intensity Interval training (HIIT) can help you get more bang far your sourcise time. Practiced by elize athletes, HIIT' is a beneficial approach for average exercises. Tou can practice interval torining by alternating short bursts (about 30 seconds) of intense activity with larger intervals (about 1 to 2 minutes) of law-intense activity.

Q: How to stop snoring?

A: Nearly everyone snores occasionally, but it can sometimes become a chronic problem. Frequent snoring should be evaluated by your health care provider, as it could signal sleep apnea. Other signs of possible obstructive sleep apnea include daytime sleepiness, loud snoring, breathing pauses and gasping or choking during sleep.

Lifestyle measures can help. Losing excess weight and stopping smoking can alleviate snoring. So can sleeping on your side instead of your back. Avoid drinking alcohol close to bedtime and aim to get 7 to 9 hours of sleep every 24 hours.

If you have sleep apnea, your health care provider may recommend continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP), a device which involves wearing a specialized mask connected to a hose that delivers steady air pressure during sleep. A dental oral appliance that helps position your jaw, tongue and soft palate can sometimes be beneficial. Other options include treating nasal congestion and practicing upper airway exercises. Much less commonly, surgery may be advised for snoring.

Here are some kay steps you can take to help someone who might be at this for suicide.

- Add the person about thoughts or plane to have themselves. Duing so does not increase the dait; in fact, it demonstrates that you care.
- Remove access to means of self-harm, such as firments.
- 3. Encourage the person to arek professional help if they bewen't absorby Medication and centric forms of therapy, such as cognitive behavioral therapy and dialactical behavior therapy. Free 24-hour bothnes are available, tou: The National Solicide Prevention Lifetime is 800-273-8255. In case of inculment danger, call 911.
- 4. Consider ways you can apport the peaks, whether it's simply allesing to listen when they're oper, sending a comp note or doing practical forms for them.
- 5. Pollow up after a crisis or hospitalization. Keep showing that you caus.


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
