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# Cal/OSHA Reminds Employers to Protect Outdoor Workers from Heat Illness During Excessive Heat in California

Cal/OSHA is reminding all employers to protect outdoor workers from heat illness as excessive heat watches have been issued throughout California. The temperature is forecast to exceed 105 degrees in northern and inland parts of the state this week including areas around Sacramento, Fresno and the eastern parts of the Bay Area.

"Employers in California must take steps to protect outdoor workers from heat illness by training all employees on the signs of heat illness and how to prevent getting sick, as well as providing and encouraging the use of water and cool-down rest breaks in the shade," said Cal/OSHA Chief Jeff Killip. "It is important to stay vigilant and closely observe all employees during heat waves, especially those who are not used to working in high heat."

Cal/OSHA's heat illness prevention standard applies to all outdoor worksites. To prevent heat illness, the law requires employers to provide outdoor workers fresh water, access to shade at 80 degrees and whenever requested by a worker, cool-down rest breaks in addition to regular breaks and maintain a written prevention plan with training on the signs of heat illness and what to do in case of an emergency.

In certain industries, when the temperature at outdoor worksites reaches or exceeds 95 degrees, Cal/OSHA's standard requires additional protections. The industries with high-heat requirements are agriculture, construction, landscaping, oil and gas extraction and transportation of agricultural products, construction materials or other heavy industrial and commercial products. High-heat procedures include ensuring employees are observed regularly for signs of heat illness and establishing effective communication methods so workers can contact a supervisor when needed.

Employers with outdoor workers in all industries must take the following steps to prevent heat illness:

**Plan** – Develop and implement an effective written heat illness prevention plan that includes emergency response procedures.

**Training** – Train all employees and supervisors on heat illness prevention.

**Water** – Provide drinking water that is fresh, pure, suitably cool and free of charge so that each worker can drink at least 1 quart per hour, and encourage workers to do so.

**Rest** – Encourage workers to take a cool-down rest in the shade for at least five minutes when they feel the need to do so to protect themselves from overheating. Workers should not wait until they feel sick to cool down.

**Shade** – Provide proper shade when temperatures exceed 80 degrees. Workers have the right to request and be provided shade to cool off at any time.

Cal/OSHA's Heat Illness Prevention special emphasis program includes enforcement of the heat regulation as well as multilingual outreach and training programs for California's employers and workers. Details on heat illness prevention requirements and training materials are available online on Cal/OSHA's Heat Illness Prevention web page and the 99calor.org informational website. A Heat Illness Prevention online tool is also available on Cal/OSHA's website.

Cal/OSHA helps protect workers from health and safety hazards on the job in almost every workplace in California. 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# Employers Get Ready - CCPA Employee and B2B Exemptions End, Expanded Privacy Compliance Begins in 2023

For the past few years, California's comprehensive privacy law known as the California Consumer Privacy Act ("CCPA") included an important partial exemption for employees, applicants, and independent contractors (collectively, "workforce members"). The California Privacy Rights Act, which amended the CCPA, extended the exemption through December 31, 2022. While many expected the exemption would be extended, the current California legislative session ended on August 31, 2022, without a bill to do so.

The failure to get an extension across the legislative finish line leaves CCPA-covered businesses with not much time to begin expanding their CCPA compliance efforts. Currently, compliance with respect to workforce members, and certain others, is limited. It includes, in general, providing a notice at or before the time of collection


of personal information and maintaining reasonable safeguards to protect certain personal information. By comparison, employers will need to, among other things, expand their privacy policy to address workforce members and be ready to respond to the requests of workforce members concerning their rights under the CCPA, including the right to delete their personal information.

Another exemption, known by some as the "B2B" exemption, generally excluded the personal information of individuals in their capacities as representatives of entities doing business with CCPA-covered businesses. It appears that exemption also will cease to apply in California on January 1, 2023.

provide some helpful information, addressing questions such as:

- Which businesses does the CCPA/CPRA apply to?
- What is personal information under the CCPA?
- Does the CCPA apply to employee/applicant data?

Of course, the last question is modified by this development and we will be updating the FAQs accordingly, as well as for CPRA regulations, which currently are in proposed form.

Key steps for compliance will include, among other things:

Getting a better handle on the personal information collected, used, retained, and disclosed about workforce members, updating the business' privacy policy, updating agreements with service providers, and

Training staff on responding to requests from workforce members concerning their privacy rights under the CCPA.

It is worth noting that the other four states with comprehensive privacy laws - Colorado, Connecticut, Utah, and Virginia – all have excluded the personal information of individuals when acting in an employment or commercial context.

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# <u>EARTHQUAKES:</u> BEFORE, DURING, AND AFTER

To survive an earthquake and reduce its health impact requires preparedness, planning and practices. Having emergency supplies, knowing what to do during and after an earthquake may save lives.

#### BEFORE AN EARTHQUAKE

- Know where the first aid kits are and make sure they have all of the needed supplies.
- Know where the fire extinguishers are located and that they are operating properly.
- Know where to shut off utilities if you are designated to do so.
- Know your company's Emergency Escape Plan and know where it is posted.
- If you work in an area that has hazardous materials or other dangers, you need to leave that area during an earthquake.
- Know the location of your Emergency Staging Area and have regular earthquake drills.
- Make sure shelving, heavy objects on walls, signs, etc. are secured using earthquake approved methods.

#### **DURING AN EARTHQUAKE**

- Drop, Cover and Hold If you are not in a hazardous area, find a table, desk or other piece of equipment, cover your head and hold onto a table, desk or equipment leg.
- Move into a hallway or get against an inside wall, staying clear of windows, heavy objects that may fall over and any other furniture pieces that are free standing.
- If you are in a hazardous materials area, leave the area. If you need to leave the building, watch for falling debris.
- If you are outside, get into an open area away from



buildings, power lines and anything else that may fall.

- If you are inside a building, exit the building, being careful of falling debris and debris on the ground.
- Go to the Emergency Staging Area. STAY THERE! You need to wait for your supervisor or emergency personnel to tell you that it is safe to leave.
- A head count or roll call needs to be taken to make sure no one is missing.
- Do not tie up telephone lines. Use the telephone for emergencies only.
- Utilities should be shut off by qualified employees only.
- If there are injuries, only trained personnel should attempt first aid and rescue.
- Wait for a member of your company who is in charge to tell you when you can either go home or go back into the building.

#### **CONCLUSION**

- Plan ahead and know what to do before an earthquake happens.
- Drop, Cover, and Hold if appropriate.
- Leave hazardous material areas.
- Go to your Emergency Staging Area and stay there until you are released.

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# TYPES OF RESPIRATORY PROTECTION



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Elastomeric Full Facepiece Respirators are reusable and have replaceable canisters, cartridges, or filters. The facepiece covers the face and eyes, which offers eye protection.



Filtering Facepiece Respirators are disposable half facepiece respirators that filter out particles such as dusts, mists, and fumes. They do NOT provide protection against gases and vapors.



Powered Air-Purifying Respirators (PAPRs) have a battery-powered blower that pulls air through attached filters, canisters, or cartridges. They provide protection against gases, vapors, or particles, when equipped with the appropriate cartridge, canister, or filter. Loose-fitting PAPRs do not require fit testing and can be used with facial hair.



Supplied-Air Respirators are connected to a separate source that supplies clean compressed air through a hose. They can be lightweight and used while working for long hours in environments not immediately dangerous to life and health (IDLH).



Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBAs) are used for entry into or escape from environments considered to be IDLH. They contain their own breathing air supply and can be either open circuit or closed circuit.



Combination Respirators can be either a supplied-air/ SCBA respirator or supplied-air/air-purifying respirator. The SCBA type has a self-contained air supply if primary airline fails and can be used in IDLH environments. The air-purifying type offers protection using both a suppliedair hose & an air-purifying component and cannot be used for entry into IDLH environments.




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
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
## Board Rules Workplace Policies Limiting Wearing Union Insignia, including Union Apparel, are Unlawful Absent Special Circumstances

The National Labor Relations Board issued a decision in Tesla, Inc., in which the Board overruled Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., 368 NLRB No. 146 (2019), and reaffirmed longstanding precedent holding that employer attempts to impose any restriction on the display of union insignia, including by wearing union apparel, are presumptively unlawful, absent special circumstances that justify such a restriction. Wal-Mart Stores had previously held that the "special-circumstances" test applies only when an employer completely prohibits union insignia, and that lesser sizeand-appearance restrictions on union insignia could be deemed lawful based on less compelling employer interests.

After consideration of public comment through a Notice and Invitation for Briefing, see Tesla, Inc., 370 NLRB No. 88 (2021), a Board majority consisting of Chairman McFerran and Members Wilcox and Prouty found that it was unlawful for Tesla to maintain a policy requiring employees to wear a plain black t-shirt or one imprinted with the employer's logo, thus prohibiting employees from substituting a shirt bearing union insignia. The Board reaffirmed that, consistent with Republic Aviation Corp. v. NLRB, 324 U.S. 793 (1945), when an employer interferes in any way with employees' right under Section 7 of the National Labor Relations Act to display union insignia, that interference is presumptively unlawful, and the employer has the burden to establish special circumstances that make the rule necessary to maintain production or discipline. The majority then found that Tesla failed to establish special circumstances in this case.

"Wearing union insignia, whether a button or a t-shirt, is a critical form of protected communication. For many decades, employees have used insignia to advocate for their workplace interests – from supporting organizing campaigns, to protesting unfair conditions in the workplace – and the law has always protected them," said Chairman Lauren McFerran. "With today's decision, the Board reaffirms that any attempt to restrict the wearing of union clothing or insignia is presumptively unlawful and – consistent with Supreme Court precedent – an employer has a heightened burden to justify attempts to limit this important right."

Members Kaplan and Ring dissented.

# Feds won't enforce contractor COVID-19 vaccine mandate

The Biden administration will not enforce its mandate for federal contractors to be vaccinated against COVID-19, despite a recent ruling which blocked a previous injunction against it in half the states. According to a post on the General Services Administration's COVID-19 Safer Federal Workforce website, the federal government will take no action to implement or enforce Executive Order 14042, which was issued on Sept. 9, 2021 and required federal contractors to get the vaccine.

#### Cal/OSHA inspects work sites during heat wave

The California Division of Occupational Safety and Health issued a heat advisory for parts of the state and ramped up inspections around the state, reminding businesses to implement protections for workers. "Those protections are making sure they have access to water, encouraging employees to take a cool-down rest break in the shade to drink water, and then having emergency procedures in place in case somebody does get ill," said David Hornung, district director for Cal/OSHA.

#### Construction planning numbers fall

Nonresidential construction planning dipped in August, providing a further sign that rising interest rates and fear of a pending recession is stalling upcoming projects. The Dodge Momentum Index, which broadly measures activity in the planning stages for new nonresidential building projects and leads spending in the sector by a full year, fell 1.2% in August. It was weighed down by a 5.2% decline in the institutional sector, which includes education, healthcare, transportation and public and religious buildings. Compared to a year ago, however, the index was still significantly positive, up 14% from August 2021. The commercial component, which includes retail, warehouses, office, hotels and parking garages, was 16% higher than 12 months earlier, with institutional projects 10% higher.

# Women stepping up to fill construction labor shortages

Women in construction earn roughly 95% of a male counterpart's median salary, and the number of women in the industry has risen 54.7% to 1.2 million since 2012, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. That increase can be attributed in part to a digital recruitment campaign from the Associated General Contractors of America in the fight against workforce shortages. Full Story: CBS

# Aug. construction job count up 16K, jobless rate grows

Construction unemployment climbed to 3.9% last month from 3.5% in July even as the industry added 16,000 jobs, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Gains were experienced across the board except for in heavy and civil engineering construction, where the job total was down 2,000 in August. # Construction unemployment rose in August, and that's good news for contractors

The construction unemployment rate rose to 3.9% in August, a significant jump from July's near record low of 3.5%, providing evidence that the sector's overheated jobs market is beginning to cool without cratering. According to an analysis of Bureau of Labor Statistics data by Associated Builders and Contractors, nonresidential construction employment rose by a net 4,300 positions. Nonresidential specialty trades added 5,600 new jobs, while nonresidential building added 700. Heavy and civil engineering employment fell by 2,000 positions. After declining for several months, the labor force participation rate — a measure of people working or looking for work — rose meaningfully, according to Basu, from 62.1% to 62.4%. With wages expanding 5.2% in all industries over the last year, and 5.3% in construction, it's an indication that a combination of inflation and rising pay rates have induced workers back to their jobs, after the exodus of the Great Resignation.


#### BART San Jose Extension on Track to Begin Heavy Construction in 2024: Officials

BART and the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority are on track to begin construction of BART's downtown San Jose extension by 2024, officials with the two transit agencies said Friday. The six-mile, four station extension will add four new stations. The extension will include more than four miles of rail tunnel under downtown San Jose along Santa Clara Street. "What we deeply care about is building the best project, the most equitable project ever that connects the Bay Area and our communities together in a way that we would have never believed possible," said BART Board Director Janice Li.

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




