## **Better Protecting the Safety and Health of Hispanic Construction Workers**

Construction work presents some of the most hazardous conditions of any industry, accounting for 21% of all U.S. workplace fatalities in 2020.

Although injuries and fatalities impact every demographic, there has been a significant increase in the injury and fatality rates among U.S. Hispanic construction workers in recent years.

### **Injuries and Fatalities Increase Significantly Among Hispanic Construction Workers**

In 2020, the fatality rate for Hispanic construction workers in the U.S. was 41.6% higher than the rate for non-Hispanic workers, according to a recent report from the Center for Construction Research and Training (CPWR). The injury rate was 14.5% higher.

This represented a significant increase compared to 2011, when the injury rate for Hispanic workers was 20.5% lower than that of non-Hispanic workers. Furthermore, the fatality rate for Hispanic workers increased by 46.5% from 2018 to 2020, while the rate for non-Hispanic workers decreased by 6.3%.

The CPWR report also notes that the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Survey of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses, from which its data is derived, has been found to underreport nonfatal injuries among Hispanic construction workers. And Hispanic workers now account for one-third of the U.S. construction industry.

Jorge Otalora, CHST, corporate safety director at Harkins Builders, says many elements may contribute to this recent increase in injuries and fatalities.

"There are multiple factors, some of which affect specific subgroups among our Hispanic workforce," he says. "Age and immigration status are two things to keep in mind. In addition, disparities in knowledge and skills

can be present, as well as the obvious language barrier."

Otalora notes that in many cases, the language barrier is not the leading cause of incidents and encourages employers and safety professionals to consider all the factors that could impact the safety and health of their workforce.

### **How Safety Professionals Can Better Protect the Safety and Health of Hispanic Construction Workers**

Improving conditions for Hispanic construction workers starts with a better understanding of the needs of individual team members, the tasks they perform, and how to communicate and collaborate to keep everyone safe on the job. Keep in mind that workers identifying as Hispanic or Latino come from many different backgrounds and have many different experiences.

"When developing safety policies and training materials, consider all those subgroups within the Hispanic workforce and incorporate different strategies," Otalora says.

Many intersecting factors and worker identities could impact how you tailor your safety approach. For example, you may need to provide different types of training to workers with different skill sets. Using mobile apps may be effective for younger members of your workforce but not as effective for their older peers, who may prefer traditional communication methods.

Regardless of a worker's age, Otalora says visual aids can be a valuable way to overcome any language barriers that may exist. (Remember to provide adapted materials for workers who are visually impaired.)

"Using pictograms will facilitate understanding of the material presented with little effort in the translation."

## Tools of the Trade


Free resources are available to safety professionals in the construction industry, aiming to improve training and communication with Hispanic workers.

“There are nonprofits dedicated to developing training materials for the Hispanic workforce. Partnering with those organizations offers a proactive and collaborative approach to focus on areas where our Hispanic workforce is affected,” Otorora says.

Organizations such as CPWR provide Spanish language resources, including hazard alert cards, toolbox talks, infographics, and videos to help educate Spanish-speaking team members about construction safety.

OSHA also offers a Spanish translation of its Construction eTool to familiarize safety professionals and workers with some of the most common hazards in construction work, such as falls, struck-by incidents, electrocution, and trenching and excavation.

### **Fed's Kashkari: Core inflation to drive rate decisions**

The Federal Reserve cannot risk suspending interest-rate increases after reaching 4.5% to 4.75% if a key indicator shows inflation continues to gather momentum, Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis President Neel Kashkari says. "Core services inflation -- which is the stickiest of all -- keeps climbing, and we keep getting surprised on the upside," Kashkari says. Full Story: BNN Bloomberg

Many economists surveyed by The Wall Street Journal believe a recession is likely in the next 12 months, with the average respondent putting the probability at 63%. Almost half of construction workers responding to a StrongArm Technologies survey say they are experiencing stress at work, with the main causes being difficulty finding workers and worries about adequate pay. ### **Construction adds 19,000 jobs in Sept.**

The construction industry added 19,000 jobs in September, but that paired with a better-than-expected overall US job gain of 263,000 for the month raised fears of a further sharp increase in interest rates. Much of the construction gain was in the nonresidential sector, with 13,100 added jobs, but Ken Simonson, chief economist for the Associated General Contractors of America, noted that while hourly wages grew at the fastest rate in four decades, contractors are still struggling to find qualified labor. ### **Dodge Momentum Index gains ground in Sept.**

An 11.7% jump in the institutional component led the Dodge Momentum Index to a 5.7% gain and a reading of 183.2 in September. The commercial component rose 2.9%. Full Story: Dodge Data & Analytics (10/7)

### **Big drop in city office values seen due to remote work**

Lower-quality office buildings are expected to see the biggest decline as remote work trends pull down office valuations in New York City as much as 39% by 2029, according to a report from the NYU Stern School of Business and Columbia University Business School. The trend is expected to affect other cities as well, while in New York City the overall valuation drop is predicted at \$453 billion. Full Story: Construction Dive (10/10)

### **North American crane count holds steady in Q3**

The number of cranes in North America's major cities has held steady from Q1 to Q3 2022, according to the latest Rider Levett Bucknall Crane Index. Measured cities are down by only three cranes, less than 1%, for that time period. Los Angeles, Seattle and Denver topped the list of U.S. cities with 46, 42 and 32 cranes respectively, while Toronto remained at the very top of the overall list with 230. RLB published the crane count in conjunction with its quarterly construction cost report, which indicated commercial construction has remained strong amid recessionary fears, higher staffing costs and continued inflation.

### **Labor crunch could 'rob the US' of critical infrastructure: McKinsey**

The federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act is expected to create hundreds of thousands of new job openings over its roughly five-year duration, but worker shortages in construction and related industries could stymie the effort, according to new analysis from management consulting firm McKinsey. McKinsey estimated the shortfall attributable to the infrastructure act by 2028 will be more than 160,000 workers in the contractor and subcontractor sector, 145,000 workers in the materials sector and 40,000 workers in the engineering and technical-services sector. Not addressing the issue soon threatens to waste the potential of the historic funding for U.S. infrastructure. "Failing to do so may rob the United States of tens of thousands of miles of roads, thousands of bridges, and miles of water and electrical infrastructure that could have been funded by this bipartisan investment and made our lives better for years to come," the authors wrote.

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## Regulatory Update: OSHA Expands Training Education Centers

On Oct. 4 OSHA announced the addition of a new organization to its OSHA Training Institute Education Center network and the renewal of 25 existing education centers. The voluntary program has trained more than three million people from fiscal 2020 through fiscal 2022.

Since 1992, the OTI Education Center program has provided training nationwide to private sector and federal personnel from agencies outside OSHA and trained more than 42,000 people in fiscal year 2022. OTI Education Centers are non-profit organizations that offer training courses on OSHA standards and occupational safety and health topics to workers and employers across the country.

The centers also help administer OSHA’s Outreach Training Program and fulfill the program’s monitoring requirements. They are the sole distribution channel for Outreach Training Program trainer courses, including OSHA standards and update courses. The program trained more than three million people from fiscal 2020 through fiscal 2022. This voluntary program is not a training requirement of any OSHA standard.

Following a national competition, the new and renewed OTI Education Centers were announced on April 18, 2022. The

competition evaluated applicants on the following criteria:

- organizational commitment, experience and qualifications;
- staff experience and qualifications; location and training facilities;
- marketing and administrative capabilities;
- Diversity Equity Inclusion and Accessibility; and
- language accessibility.

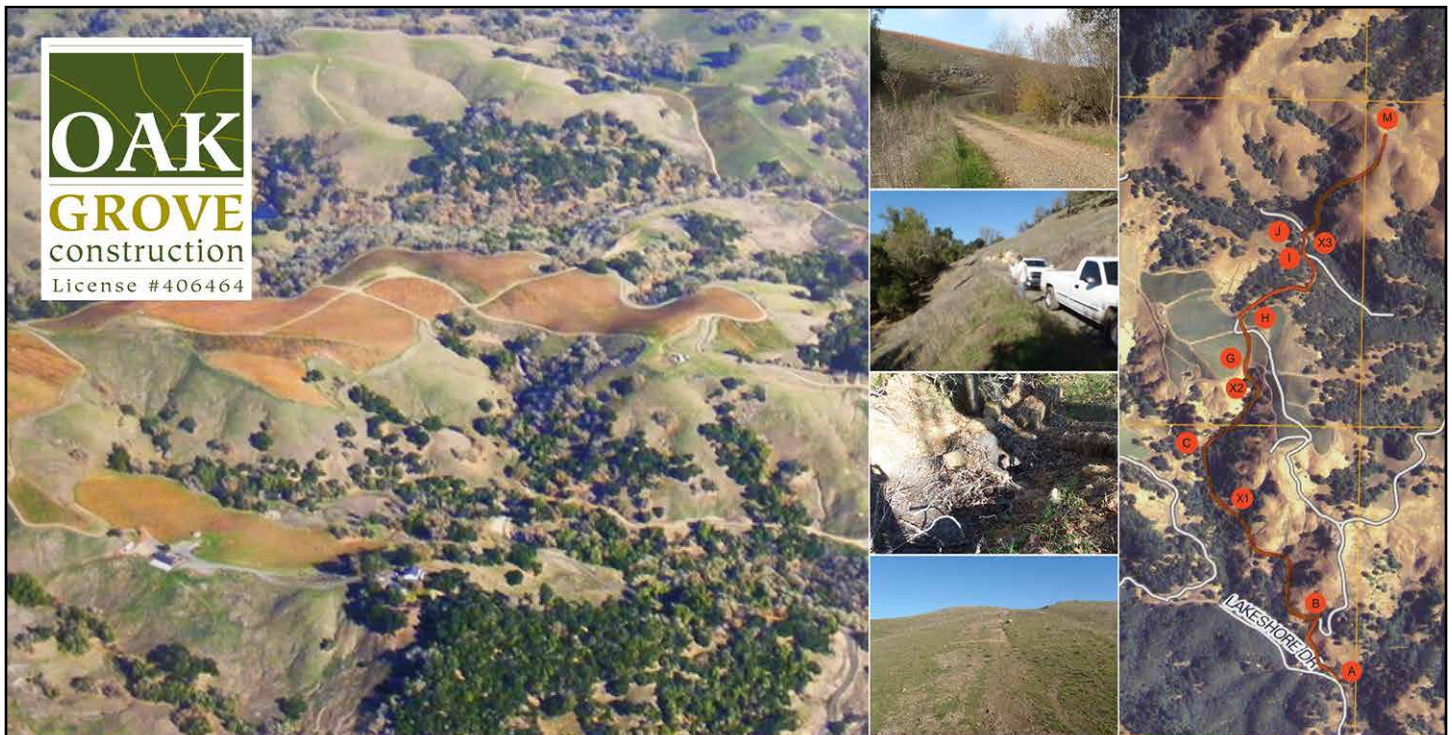

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## The Evolution Of Risk Management And Workplace Safety

Over the years, workplace safety has evolved from a focus on employee behavior and OSHA compliance to a focus on culture, safe conditions, and conformance with organization objectives. Companies that demonstrate a commitment to safety, and the well-being of their employees' lives, are actively demonstrating their dedication to a workplace culture that values health and safety. Overall, the organizations that prioritize safety and a "people first" approach rise to the top.

### What is your perspective on the evolution of safety — particularly, how it has evolved over the past decade?

There has been a lot of positive change in safety over the last 10 years, starting with companies intensifying investments in support of enterprise-level comprehensive safety cultures. This is thanks to deeper regulatory understanding and enhanced awareness of the role employers play in keeping employees safe from accident, illness, and death. And even more specific dimensions, such as manufacturers developing personal protection equipment (PPE) that is multipurpose, comfortable, and even stylish, which results in increased compliance.

Overall, technology is improving workplace safety by fundamentally changing how training, monitoring, reporting, and worker's compensation are done. Employees can take advantage of new technologies to manage risk and improve real-time high-speed communication more effectively.

### What new technologies are you excited about?

The possibilities brought about by new technologies are endless, and their potential for expanding coverage and improving compliance and effectiveness are exciting. Advances in technology have made safe work practices increasingly achievable.

I am particularly excited by the multipurpose application possibilities of security cameras that can also generate critical safety data, and robotics and virtual reality technologies that will continue to help increase access to education and assist in avoiding injuries or fatalities. I also see great potential in the personalized and empowering benefits of wearable technology with the ability to track biometrics, read bar codes, and generate alerts if there has been an exposure to toxic elements.

### What advances in safety training are you seeing now?

Virtual reality has great potential to change how training is delivered and also change the training experience as a whole, making training itself even safer. For example, by delivering virtual training, employees won't be exposed to the conditions that they need to be trained in, so training can be conducted in a safe place in an interactive way.



Advances in safety training will give employers the ability to create consistent safety cultures across multiple locations and provide the tools that improve compliance and reporting. Having timely access to information can increase the reach and coverage of safety programs and decrease the overall cost of those programs. These are all key elements of an effective safety program.

### How does the culture of safety align with an engaged corporate culture?

Implementing an effective safety culture requires bringing together levels within an organization to work on a common goal as important as keeping people safe and healthy. So, employees see firsthand the investments and steps employers take to protect them from injury, illness, and death. This can help increase employee engagement, job satisfaction, and a sense of community, ultimately helping to strengthen the corporate culture of an organization.



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## **Turner: Labor shortage prompts contractors to be selective about jobs**

Long lead times for materials also make bidding a challenge. Rivetti shared the broad philosophy that Turner, the largest builder in the U.S. by revenue, uses to remain competitive.

“A focused and strategic approach to procurement that engages contractors, designers, suppliers, manufacturers and clients reduces the risk of price escalation and produces the most competitive results for our clients,” Rivetti said.

Construction unemployment is down — meaning the vast majority of skilled, experienced workers have jobs. That will only continue to keep costs high, according to Anirban Basu, chief economist at Associated Builders and Contractors.

A hot job market means workers can bargain for higher wages. That in part may prompt Federal Reserve policymakers to aggressively tighten interest rates further. If that continues, the recovery in nonresidential activity would likely buckle, Basu said.

Nevertheless, the outlook is generally stable, as backlog remains steady and contractors anticipate rising sales, employment and profit margins over the next half year, Basu said.

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## Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors

How can you keep your license number ‘relative’ when it’s ‘low’ down? Expert assistance gets it done! A lawyer gets ‘guidance’ in achieving his goal, while I ‘bang the drum’ once more on upcoming changes for contractors in the New Year...

**Q:** I am the qualifier on my company’s license, and I also have a personal/Sole Owner license with a number that is low. I don’t plan to use my personal license again in the future as I’m part of the Union and they have rules against operating outside of the Union. Am I able to give the license to my brother who is also a licensed contractor?

**A:** A Sole /Owner license number can be transferred to a family member if the license holder is retiring (or if they pass away) and the license number is necessary to continue a family business. Since that isn’t the case (thank goodness), if you were to transfer your Sole Owner to a Corporation or Limited Liability Company (LLC), and then have your brother take over the license, he would be able to operate with that low number. It’s a multi-step process but it would get you the result you are looking for!

**Q:** I am an Attorney, and my client is selling his contracting business. The buyer is planning to convert the entity from a Corporation to an LLC. The concern which is making all parties nervous is the seller has had some bad experiences in dealing with the CSLB in the past and has advised us that this transfer process may take longer than expected, therefore exposing the company to some risk of being unlicensed or not properly licensed.

In his experience, applications are frequently rejected, and I was hoping you could give us some guidance on what issues we may run into. What would cause the application to be rejected?

**A:** There are all kinds of reasons why an application may be rejected. However, keep in mind that most of the time a CSLB “rejection” is just a request for a correction or further information. One of the most common reasons for an LLC application to be rejected is the Secretary of State filings not being done, or not matching the information reflected on the license application. I am happy to assist with the license transfer process which gives you a thick layer of protection from running into any of the “issues” the parties

are concerned about.

One Last Time! Bond increases take effect on January 1, 2023. Also starting on that same date, concrete (“C-8”), HVAC (“C-20”), asbestos abatement (“C-22”), and tree service (“D-49”) contractors will be required to have worker’s compensation insurance, regardless of whether they have employees.
