### An unusual 'Exit Interview' with our retiring NCBE CEO

So, after 32 years in Chamber of Commerce work and then 21 years at the North Coast Builders Exchange, I'm hanging up my briefcase at the end of this month.

I'm a big believer in Exit Interviews when an employee leaves, so I thought that might be a good way to share some parting thoughts with NCBE members. And I found just the right person to conduct my Exit Interview – me. Here goes:

Two more things stand out for me:

One was the creation of our "Crown Jewel" program six years ago – the North Bay Construction Corps which has prepared hundreds of high school seniors for a rewarding career in construction. The Career Technical Education Foundation, SRJC, and the Sonoma County Office of Education were amazing partners in that effort and it wouldn't have happened without them.

The second was the hundreds of hours that NCBE staff and volunteers provided to fire victims and contractors after the devastating fires over the last five years. I

### 5 Things to know about recording Mechanic's Liens post pandemic

#### Mechanic's Liens, Stop Payment Notices and collection activities & lawsuits

You did the work, but you remain unpaid. For weeks (if not months), you patiently waited and cooperated in the hopes of getting paid without "rocking the boat." But the deadline to record your lien is fast approaching and you just heard "you will be paid shortly" one too many times. Frustrated, you contact your attorney and request that a mechanic's lien be recorded TODAY!

The problem is that the Pandemic has even impacted the logistics for recording mechanic's liens. It is nearly impossible for you, your attorney and lien services to currently prepare and record a mechanic's lien the same day (or even the next day). In fact, during the early months of the pandemic, it sometimes took 4 to 6 weeks and sometimes 8 weeks to record a document. While it is now

taking less time, it is still difficult to expedite the process. Recording a mechanic's lien requires planning and cannot be left to the last minute. This article explains why:

#### The original document is necessary

Mechanic's liens must be verified by the lien claimant, or the claimant's counsel, prior to the document being recorded. This means that the claimant/counsel must, under penalty of perjury, state that they have read/reviewed the mechanic's lien and know the content is truthful and that the claimant/counsel is authorized to sign the mechanic's lien. In order to record the mechanic's lien, the original document, with the wet signature on the lien and the

verification must be presented to the county recorder's office for recordation. Therefore, you must figure out a way to get the original document to your attorney and the county recorder's office.

## The Recorder's Offices operate at limited hours and require appointments

Since the Pandemic started, some county recorder's offices have reduced operating hours and are NOT open to the public. The Los Angeles County Recorder's Office is an example. It was closed for over a year with NO in-person services available to the public, to attorney services or to attorneys. Even after recently opening, the LA County Recorder's office has limited hours and strict in-person procedures. Norwalk (main branch), LAX/Courthouse, Van Nuys, and Lancaster branches record documents BY APPOINTMENT ONLY. The appointments are available online only two weeks in advance and are typically booked and unavailable. While writing this article (and on multiple

days) I attempted to reserve an appointment at the various locations, and all were booked for the next two weeks!

Note: Mechanic's liens can be mailed to the recorder's office, but the turnaround time is unknown.

#### Mechanic's Lien can be rejected and returned without being recorded

It is not uncommon for the recorder's office to reject and not record a mechanic's lien for even minor technical reasons. Examples include portions of the notary stamp being faded, or some letters not being properly capitalized. It also appears that due to staffing challenges, temporary and new employees are processing the documents for recordation and sometimes unnecessarily rejecting mechanic's liens. Once a document is rejected, it must be corrected and resubmitted!

#### The Recorder's Offices do not backdate documents

Once a mechanic's lien is submitted to the recorder's office (whether in-person, or electronically), the document is put in a que and then processed. It can take days or weeks for the document to be processed. The mechanic's lien is

stamped "recorded" on the date the document is processed NOT when the document was submitted. This means that your mechanic's lien will NOT be recorded the day it is submitted to the recorder's office. The processing time will depend on the county and the county recorder's workload at the time of submittal. It is unpredictable and cannot be guaranteed.

If the recorder rejects your document, it must be resubmitted as a new document, and you are back in the que once again waiting to be processed. Even if the county delayed the recordation, the mechanic's lien will NOT be backdated.

#### Online Recordations Are Still Not Available To Attorneys

While some title companies and attorney services may have the capability to electronically record property related documents, electronic recording is not yet available to attorneys. Even if attorneys outsource the recordation to vendors with electronic recording capabilities, the original document with the wet signature must be delivered for the digital recordation. Again, this means mailing, messengering, or expediting the document to the vendor for recordation. This process takes at least a day. Then, when the document is electronically submitted to the county


recorder's office, it is not immediately recorded and is placed in the electronic que and recorded once the county processes the document.

It has now become nearly impossible to prepare, serve and record a mechanic's lien the same day! Since the deadline to record a mechanic's lien can often be short, plan ahead and do not leave your mechanic's lien to the last minute! Give yourself (and your attorneys) at least three to four weeks and sufficient time to deal with unexpected glitches and delays.

If you are unfamiliar with preparing or recording mechanic's liens or have specific questions about application of the mechanic's lien laws and deadlines, you should seek the advice of legal counsel who is familiar with California lien laws.

## Construction equipment Section 179 and bonus depreciation: Should you take advantage?

With a little time left in the year to acquire equipment, now is a good time to see how these tax advantages might give you access to machines that can build your 2022 business

It's only December — too early to think about tax season, right? Actually, with just a little time left in the year to acquire equipment, now is a good time to determine whether you can take advantage of Section 179 and bonus depreciation on your 2021 tax return. If you're not familiar with these terms, here's a quick primer on these two special deductions that can save you some cash. (This is just a high-level overview; be sure to talk to your tax professional before making any decisions for your business.)

#### What's the difference between the two?

Section 179 of the IRS Tax Code lets you deduct 100% of the purchase price of eligible equipment the year you put it into service. That means any machines you buy and have in your possession before December 31, 2021, qualify for the deduction. You don't have to be using them on a jobsite — just having them in your shop or on your property is fine.

Bonus depreciation, or Section 168(k) of the tax code, also allows for 100% expensing of equipment purchases, but it kicks in where Section 179 leaves off. Basically, you can apply Section 179 deductions to your first \$1,050,000 of equipment purchases. Any amount over that (up to a total of \$2,620,000) can then be taken in bonus depreciation.

#### What's eligible for these deductions?

A lot — both new and used heavy equipment and machinery, along with some business vehicles, office and computer equipment, off-the-shelf software and more.

You can take deductions for equipment you finance and equipment you pay for with cash.

#### What are the benefits?

Like standard depreciation, Section 179 and bonus depreciation allow you to pay less money in taxes and keep your balance sheet stable. That can make it easier to do everything from securing a loan to grow your business to accessing the funds you need to cover everyday expenses.

Here's a quick example: Say you spent \$250,000 on a new machine in 2021 and you're in the 21% income tax bracket.

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Your tax savings would be \$52,500, making your after-tax equipment cost \$197,500.

What makes Section 179 and bonus depreciation different is that they give you the power to deduct a large amount of the purchase value from your tax obligations quickly. With the standard depreciation method, you write off that same value much more slowly, over several years.

#### What's the downside?

There really isn't one — unless using the standard approach to depreciation, where the tax benefits are spread out across several years, makes more sense for your individual business goals. That's something you and your tax advisor need to discuss and decide.

#### What else do I need to know?

Bonus depreciation has been around since 2002, but it isn't permanently enshrined in tax law. Take advantage of these current tax saving measures to improve your bottom-line. Keeping a keen eye on the ever-changing tax laws and staying in close communication with your tax professional will allow you to maximize your tax savings.

## California's minimum wage to increase to \$15 per hour for large employers, \$14 per hour for small employers

Oakland—California's minimum wage will increase on January 1, 2022 to \$15 per hour for employers with 26 or more employees, and \$14 for employers with 25 or fewer employees.

In 2016, California became the first state in the nation to commit to raising the minimum wage to \$15 per hour statewide by 2022 for large businesses, and by 2023 for small businesses. This law increases the minimum wage over time consistent with economic expansion, while providing safety valves to pause wage increases if negative economic or budgetary conditions emerge.

#### **Schedule for California Minimum Wage Rate**

January 1, 2022

Minimum Wage for Employers with 26 or More Employees \$15.00/hour

Minimum Wage for Employers with 25 or Fewer Employees \$14.00/hour

January 1, 2023

Minimum Wage for Employers with 26 or More Employees \$15.00/hour

Minimum Wage for Employers with 25 or Fewer Employees \$15.00/hour

State law requires that most California workers be paid the minimum wage. Some cities and counties have a local minimum wage that is higher than the state rate. Workers paid less than the minimum wage are urged to contact the Labor Commissioner's Office to file a wage claim. In November, the Labor Commissioner's Office launched an online wage claim application in English and Spanish for workers who are owed wages or benefits.

Employers are required to post information on wages, hours and working conditions at a worksite area accessible to employees. Notices for the wage orders in English and Spanish can be downloaded and printed from the workplace postings page on the DIR website.

Employers must ensure that the wage rate is displayed on the employee's pay stub, and that employees are paid at least the minimum wage even when employees are paid at piece rate.



### Variants, Boosters & COVID workplace standards:

#### The road ahead for employers

When will COVID-19 be in our rearview mirror? That's the million-dollar question. From masks to vaccines, to variants and boosters, employers have learned to grapple with gray areas and novel questions every day. While the future of the pandemic remains uncertain, we do have some indication of where COVID workplace standards are heading in the immediate future.

#### Refresher on Cal/OSHA's Emergency Temporary Standard

For California employers, it is important to keep an eye on the California Occupational Safety and Health Administration (Cal/OSHA's) Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS). Not to be confused with federal OSHA's ETS, which is aimed at mandating the vaccine or COVID-19 testing for large employers, Cal/OSHA's ETS is focused on mitigating COVID-19 hazards in the workplace.

Cal/OSHA's ETS was originally adopted in November 2020 (and amended June 2021), to include distinctions between vaccinated and unvaccinated workers. Among many other requirements, these standards mandate that employers adopt a written COVID-19 Prevention Plan, to address employee exclusion, testing, COVID-19 reporting, etc ...

It appears that Cal/OSHA plans to extend the ETS with some amendments. A re-adopted ETS would be effective on January 14, 2022 and extend to mid-April 2022. The Cal/

OSHA Standards Board will make a final decision on this re-adoption at its December 16, 2021 meeting.

Note: Cal/OSHA's ETS does not currently mandate vaccination. However, health orders from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) mandate vaccination for healthcare workers and direct in-home care providers. For other groups such as dentists, school personnel and most state workers, unvaccinated workers must submit to weekly COVID-19 testing.

#### Federal OSHA: Vaccine or Test Mandate

Employers with 100 or more employees must also track the status of federal OSHA's Emergency Temporary Standard discussed here, which is primarily aimed at mandating the vaccine, or requiring unvaccinated workers to submit to weekly COVID-19 testing and wear face coverings. On November 12, 2021, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit granted a stay of the ETS, while the courts determine whether OSHA had the authority to adopt its ETS in the first place. OSHA announced it has suspended enforcement of the ETS "pending future developments in the litigation."

Unfortunately, it may take months before employers have

a definitive answer on whether federal OSHA's ETS will go into effect. If it does, Cal/OSHA would be required to adopt equal or more stringent guidelines focused on vaccine mandates, within 30 days.

#### The Road Ahead for Employers

With the announcement of Omicron, the new variant of concern, as well as the CDC's recommendation for all adults to receive the booster, new questions arise such as:

- Under what circumstances are employers permitted to mandate the booster shot?
- Will CDPH or other state or federal agencies mandate boosters for certain workers?
- How will enforcement agencies such as Cal/OSHA respond to Omicron?
- What can I do to best protect my workers?

The California Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) has not yet updated its guidance with respect to whether employers can mandate booster shots. As such, employers should consult counsel before doing so at this time.

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## **Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors**

### Do your employees buy into your mission?

#### There's a strong link between employee engagement and a company's financial prosperity.


How did George Washington inspire a band of farmers and bricklayers to enlist their own boats and fight in the Battle of Trenton?

The answer is that they believed in the cause. And employees need to have this same faith. "How do you inspire your employees to buy into your mission?" asked Lt. Gen. Russel Honoré, USA (Ret.). Honoré earned notoriety as the commander of Joint Task Force Katrina, and earlier this year, House Speaker Nancy Pelosi asked him to come out of retirement to review security of the Jan. 6 attack at the United States Capitol. He delivered a keynote presentation at the Safety Leadership Conference and M&T Show, held in November in Cleveland.

"Every employee must know that if we achieve our objective, we will participate in the bounty of success. And it's not just the C-suite that gets new Escalades. Everybody in the organization, when the mission is accomplished, benefits from the bounty of success. That's how General Washington got the soldiers to go out in such miserable weather. When half of them were suffering from pneumonia and upper respiratory disease, they bought into the bounty of success—and that

success would be freedom. How do we inspire our workers? By letting them know that if we meet our objective, they too will get a piece of stock."

Sharing the bounty has been a long-standing practice at some companies. For example, Lincoln Electric instituted a profit-sharing program back in 1914. Since 1934, Lincoln's bonus has never dropped below 25% of base wages or salary. It has even topped 120% some years.

Another company, U.S. Steel, offered record profit-sharing bonuses after the company's strong earnings in the second quarter of 2021. Many workers received more than \$9,000 in profit-sharing.

The link between company financial prosperity and employee engagement is circular. Companies that provide a strong employee experience (EX), to use the current term for engaged employees, see improved financial performance. A 2019 analysis by Willis Towers Watson, which included close to 50 years of research and a total database of 250 million employees, found that companies demonstrating a strong EX, where employees reported feeling inspired by the company's mission and purpose, performed stronger than competitors by a margin of 2 to 4 percentage points across key performance metrics, including return on assets and equity.

How can all companies achieve these goals? "The most significant change comes through a transformation of leadership mindset—inspiring your organization around your purpose, driving agility and innovation to be ahead of the market, helping your people achieve their potential and building a culture of leadership trust," said Stephen Young, global practice leader, Employee Insights, Willis Towers Watson, in reporting the findings.

The sense of purpose is what many employees are searching for post-pandemic. It was also true pre-pandemic. A 2019 "Mission and Culture" survey, conducted by Glassdoor, found that 79% of adults across four countries (U.S, UK, France, Germany) would consider a company's mission and purpose before applying for a job. Furthermore, over half of the 5,000 respondents said that company culture is more important than salary when it comes to job satisfaction.

While current emphasis is on attracting employees, ensuring that current employees—and especially those that will be tapped for leadership positions—are engaged is critical. As companies face many "battles" in the current marketplace, it will be employee buy-in that will bring success.
